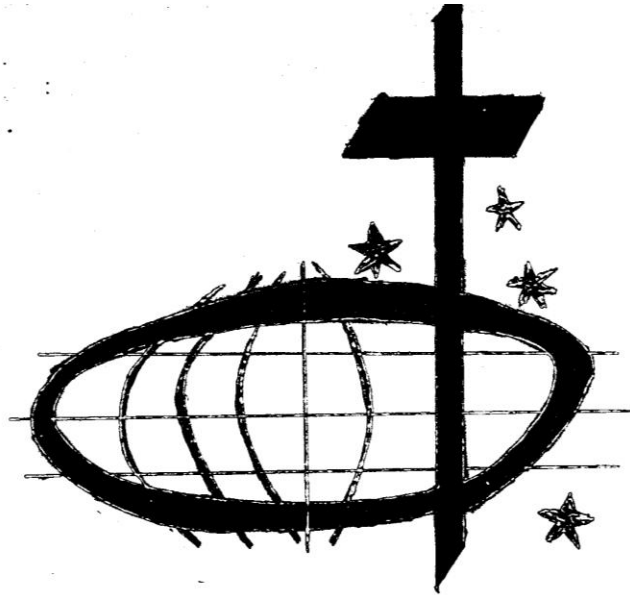

CHRISTIANS AND WORLD PEACE

WORSHIP SERVICE:

Call to Worship: Be still and know that I am God.

I will be exalted in the earth and I will be exalted  
among the nations.

Let us come before God to pray for peace among the  
whole family of nations remembering that He is the  
Father of all men,

That He has sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to teach us  
how we may glorify Him and live in goodwill towards  
one another, and,  
that He seeks continually to inspire all who will  
receive His Spirit of Truth and Love.

Prayer of Adoration:

Eternal God, our loving Heavenly Father, who made the world and all  
things in it, and art Lord of Heaven and Earth, we worship Thee.  
In Thee we live and move and have our being, and our hearts are  
restless until they find their rest in Thee.

We ask that Thy Holy Spirit of power may come into our lives today  
and that our hearts may burn with love for Christ and all men so  
that there may be peace in the world and Thy Kingdom come on earth,  
through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

PRAISE: Psalm 100 tune "Old 100th".

Him serve with mirth, His praise forthtell,  
Come ye before Him and rejoice.

Know that the Lord is God indeed!  
Without our aid He did us make:  
We are His flock, He doth us feed,

Approach with joy His courts unto:  
Praise, laud and bless His name always,  
For it is seemly so to do.

For Why? The Lord our God is good,  
His mercy is for ever sure;

**MEDITATION:**

Let us remember;

- . "The whole world's in His hand".
- . God is the Father of all mankind.
- . There are some who do not confess Christ, but still seek and work for peace: The Dalai Lama of Tibet has said -  
' You cannot force men of ill-will into peace. You must win them. '
- . In the bedroom of Mahatma Ghandi, there was only one picture on the wall, that of Jesus Christ on the Cross, and underneath the words, 'He is our Peace'.
- . As Christians, we must help to preserve and promote those things which belong to God's peace;
- . To overcome hatred,
- . To establish friendly relations,
- . To secure for all people freedom from hunger and disease,
- . To provide for all people education to develop resources, their minds and creative arts,
- . To give an opportunity for all men to follow Jesus Christ, Who said:

"I am the Way, the Truth and the Life."

Leader: For all who have laboured and suffered for freedom, justice and the welfare of mankind,

Response: We praise Thee, O God and bless Thy Name.

Leader: For all who spend their lives in service to their fellowmen in dark places of the earth

Response: We praise Thy Name, O God.

Leader: For personal greeds and inconsiderate assertions creating a spirit of ill-will

Response: Lord have mercy upon us.

Leader: For ignorance, intolerance, thoughtlessness and lack of sympathy.

Response: Lord have mercy upon us.

Leader: For our trust in force, boastfulness, pride and the spirit of revenge,

Response: Lord have mercy upon us.

Leader: Cleanse and transform our wills, O God, that we may not sow seeds of salamity, and enlarge our trust in the things that make for peace, that we may help to establish Thy Kingdom and be numbered among the peace-makers, who are called the children of God,

through Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour,  
AMEN.

PRAISE: "O Lord our God, Arise"      Tune: Doncaster.

O Lord our God, arise!

The cause of truth maintain,

DEDICATION OF OFFERING:

O Lord, of Thy Hands have we received these gifts, which we

hungry and all who are being drawn to Thee through our efforts.  
Give peace, O Lord, in their hearts, and this we ask in the  
name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.  
AMEN.

PRAISE:

Turn back, O men, forswear thy foolish ways:  
Old now is earth and none may count her days,  
Yet thou, her child, whose head is crowned with flame,  
Still wilt not hear thine inner God proclaim -  
"Turn back, O man, forswear thy foolish ways".

Earth might be fair and all men glad and wise;  
Age after age their tragic empires rise,  
Built while they dream and in that dreaming weep;  
Would man but wake from out his haunted sleep,  
Earth might be fair and all men glad and wise.

Earth shall be fair, and all her people one;

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STUDY MATERIAL:

CHRISTIANS AND WORLD PEACE

This study should be used in groups of 10 - 12, with a leader who has had the opportunity to prepare for the discussion.

Readings: 1) Micah 4: 1 - 5  
2) Ephesians 2: 11 - 18

- (A) 1. Micah expresses an age old aspiration of man.  
Can you think of other leaders through the ages who have made a plea for peace?  
What have been the significant peace movements in the 20th century.
2. Plowshares and pruninghooks are both agricultural instruments. What is the significance of this in relation to hunger today?
3. "They shall sit every man under his vine and under his fig tree and none shall make them afraid."  
What does this mean for us as citizens? Does it go far enough? Is peace merely the absence of conflict?
- (B) 1. In Ephesians, Paul speaks of the relationship between Jews and Gentiles. How can we apply his words to inter-racial problems?
2. Is there any connection between peace in the soul or serenity of spirit and peace between nations?
3. What can we do as individuals or church groups to promote peace?
