

AUSTRALIAN CHURCH WOMEN - N.S.W. STATE UNIT

MINUTES of COUNCIL MEETING held at 222 Pitt Street, Sydney on Monday
March 17, 1997 at 10.30 a.m.

OPENING: Due to President Peg Blake's indisposition, Past President Lucelle King welcomed members and led devotions and opened the meeting with prayer.

PRESENT: 50 as per Attendance Sheets.

APOLOGIES: 6 including President.

Lucelle King informed the meeting of the death of Dr. Juliet Backhouse on March 9 - she was an Anglican member of Australian Church Women. Juliet had served with the Church Missionary Society in Tanzania for 24 years, a very gifted and dedicated doctor. A Thanksgiving Service for her life was held on March 12 at St. James Anglican Church, Turramurra, which Margaret Jessup and Mina Whybourne attended.

Rachel McManus, one of the Winifred Kiek Scholars for 1997, was then introduced and Rachel told of her position at the Cross Roads Centre at Redfern for aboriginal people, of her involvement with the young people with drug and alcohol problems, how she takes groups away for weekends as far away as Burren Junction to help them overcome their addictions and to tell them of Jesus Christ. She read the story of Daniel and the lions' den and how he was protected by God - and she believes God has put her in this position in Redfern and will protect her. She found that she has aboriginal ancestry and so has inherited a much larger family and she is finding this very exciting. She is studying for a Diploma of Theology at Robert Menzies College and the WKS Scholarship pays the fees and her books. She was sponsored by the Mothers' Union and Rev. John Macintyre from St. Saviours Redfern helps with advice, etc.

Rachel answered many questions and asked for prayer from members - for strength from God to be Christ-like in all that she undertakes and to have spiritual discernment.

Lucelle thanked Rachel for her very moving account of her position as a Youth Worker in a difficult area and assured her of our prayers and presented her with a rose bouquet and a gift.

The Minutes of Meeting of Monday February 17 1997 were read and confirmed on motion of Elaine Giddey and Vi Minty. Carried.

Forms will be available in due course - suggestion of a special uniform - possibly required 8 hours a day for 5/6 days. We will be kept informed. There will be places for a "Quiet Time".

Heather Reid (Social Issues Convener) had written to Liberal Party and to Dr Marlene Goldsmith commending them for their stand on several issues. Had written regarding a book set for HSC students using obscene language and regarding the exploitation of the young lass in "Dolly" magazine.
