Christmas Day.—In preparation the Churches were tastefully decorated, though the scarcity of material necessitated a more modest attempt than usual. Despite the heat the services were well attended, and by the enthusiastic efforts of the Choirs and their leaders the festal character of the season was well emphasized. Perhaps we should rejoice that there were just over 460 persons who made their Christmas Communion, but the thought naturally arises why so few from Sunday to Sunday? The two Sunday Schools attended in the afternoon at the Parish Church and rendered the service a very appropriate and hearty one by the singing of well-known and tuneful Christmas Carols. The music was well rendered by the Choir at the morning and evening services. The Canticles were sung to Winchester's setting in F, and the Communion offices to Adlam's music. The anthems were Goss's "Behold, I bring you Good Tidings," and Simper's "Worship Him and Sing of Him." The service generally was very bright and the congregation joined heartily in the familiar Christmas hymns and psalms.

The First Divine Service in Australia.—In accordance with resolutions passed by the Provincial Synod special and appropriate services commemorative of this event will be held at both Churches in this Parish on Sunday, January 29th.

Obituary.—Since the issue of our last number the former Incumbent (Rev. C. Bauber) has assisted the Rector at the burial of two of the oldest members of the Church in this parish. On November 28th Mrs. Loveridge passed to her rest and was buried at Rookwood. For many years a regular and devout worshipper at All Saints' she always shewed a keen interest in the welfare of the parish, which was shared by her late husband and by her sons and daughters, who were all at one time actively associated with the various branches of Church work.

Scarcely a week later, on December 5th, Mrs. Mullen, the widow of the late Mr. George Mullen, for 3 years Warden of All Saints', was called to lay down the cross of suffering which she has borne with touching patience and resignation for the last ten years. Mrs. Mullen was buried in the churchyard at Canterbury.

Of both these good churchwomen it may be said that their chief life's work was done in a good woman's palace—her home—and that their children in consequence rise up and call them blessed. It is much to be regretted that their deaths will bring about the removal from our parochial roll of the names of two families who have been amongst the foremost worshippers and workers in the Church.

Perkins presented the prizes, and in reviewing the past year's work drew attention to the increase in numbers and the improvement in the quality of the work done.

ALL SAINTS' PAROCHIAL DAY SCHOOL PRIZES were presented on Tuesday, December 20th, in the Town Hall, when there was a crowded attendance of parents and friends.

After the Kinderspiel "The Comrades," which was repeated from the recent Concert, the Rector took the chair, and Mr. F. W. Wippell presented the prizes to the successful scholars, a list of whom will be published in our next issue. In addition to the School prizes, special prizes were given by Mrs. Hordern, Mr. R. C. Wills for his Drill Class, and by the Rector for Scripture and Prayer Book. Mr. Wippell and Mr. Wills made appreciative comments on the condition of the School, and very enthusiastic applause was given for the Head Mistress and her assistants.

The scholars very thoughtfully made presentations to Mrs. Hordern, Mr. Wills, Miss Green, and to the Rector and Mrs. Goddard.
