



## AUSTRALIAN CHURCH WOMEN NSW STATE UNIT

MINUTES of COUNCIL MEETING held at 222 Pitt Street, Sydney on Monday 20 August 2001 at 10.30 am.

President Jan Harrison welcomed back Ethel Wladysiuk after illness. Jan spoke of hope renewing itself every morning. In Jesus - life, hope & liberty - being free from whatever binds us. In Australia we take our freedom lightly - but captive status is a frightening possibility as we hear of those in hostage situations. Scriptural passages assure liberty to captives, the setting free of the oppressed so that even those who lack physical freedom may be spiritually enriched. Jan prayed for those in captivity and bondage.

The Minutes of Council Meeting of Monday 18 June 2001 were confirmed on the motion of Thora Thomas and Lily Hanlon. Carried.

### BUSINESS ARISING:

1. Spiritual Enrichment Day was a time of renewal as people contemplated the Images of God. The efforts of Colleen O'Sullivan and Marie Craddock were much appreciated.
2. Fellowship Day had seen good attendances, happy occasions and thought provoking addresses.
3. State Conference - Sydney Congress Hall Function Centre, Elizabeth Street, Sydney has been booked for Monday, 16 September 2002. Rate quoted is \$25 per person.
4. National Conference Adelaide 24-28 September 2001. Notices of Motion were distributed to Council members to enable comments to be made for the guidance of delegates and observers attending the conference.
5. City of Sydney Branch - Arrangements are in hand for a World Community Day Service in St James Church King Street, Tuesday, 23 October 2001 at 12.15 p.m. The Rev. Susanne Pain will give the address. Edith Ridge encouraged all who do not have branch meetings to attend. There is a possibility that light refreshments will be organised to follow the service. Publicity can now go ahead.
6. Annual General Meeting minutes recorded Daphne Peterson's name incorrectly. It was therefore moved Judith Baker and seconded Helen Hill that the correction be made, with apologies to Daphne.
7. Uma David from Chennai (Madras) in India will be visiting Sydney en route to Adelaide and will attend our meeting on Monday 17 September 2001. Uma is a Vice President of ACWC, a member of the Church of South India and a representative on the FLC International Committee. It was decided that each denominational group provide two plates of food (except the Catholic ladies who are on morning tea). Also decided that there should be an offering towards ACWC funds. Arrangements for Uma's itinerary in Sydney are proceeding, and members were asked to advise of functions/meetings which Uma could visit.
8. Volunteers Information from June meeting is being collated.

### INTERVIEW WITH PRESIDENT ELECT:

Jan Harrison interviewed Jean Porteous in an effort to help Council members know something of the background of our President Elect. Jean said she had grown up in a Christian home, and as a child she learned to put God first. She worked as a cashier in Sydney before training as a nurse at Western Suburbs Hospital - a hospital which had a strong Nurses' Christian Fellowship. Although her aspirations were in midwifery, a vacancy in a leprosy hospital in India was offered and she took up the challenge. Leprosy is a curable disease if given early treatment - true when Jean took up the job, and even truer today. Multi drug therapy renders the disease inactive in 3-5 years, and only 12 months for non-infectious leprosy. People in the clinics/hospitals run by Christian missions heard the gospel - felt peace and asked questions about the beliefs of those who ministered to them. Jean said she had many happy memories of her time in India. She currently serves on the Leprosy Mission National Council.

MEMBERSHIP: Daphne Peterson reported that a new address list was being compiled. She asked members to check that their details were correct.

Margaret Hawkins is to have hip and knee surgery. Ethel Wladysiuk is back after illness. Alwyn Warren was not well enough to come.

FELLOWSHIP OF THE LEAST COIN: Shirley Wells advised that she still has copies of *Circle of Prayer*. Shirley led us in a devotional - A Voice from Lebanon - God's Uplifting Power - "Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me."

WINIFRED KEIK SCHOLARSHIP: In Mina Whybourne's absence Edith Ridge reported on her contact with Dorothy Ferrier about the poor communication regarding scholars. Many do not come to Australia, do not necessarily have good English, but there is a need to inform those responsible for providing the money for scholarships. It is proposed that National Conference should explore ways to keep information coming, for example by developing the role of sponsoring bodies as channels of information.

SOCIAL ISSUES: Cela Cooper reported on an article on the internet about the women only village in Ethiopia - matercare international - telling of fistula treatment.

On the Fair wear campaign it has been observed that many retailers have signed, but not much has happened as yet. Cela suggested that if members see the label it would be good to congratulate, but if it is not seen, then perhaps it would be good to write and ask why it is not appearing.
