AUSTRALIAN CHURCH WOMEN

MINUTES of meeting of the Working Committee held at the A.C.C. Building, Sydney, on Tuesday, 5th September 1978 at 9.30 a.m.

PRESENT: Win Dougherty (President), Doris Mitchell (Hon. Secretary), Gwen Cork, Joan Curtin, Heather Stevens, Glad West.

APOLOGIES: were received from Mary Andrews, Olga Badger, Edna Baker, Betty Davis, Connie Groat, Margaret Ralph and Marjorie Stanhope.

OPENING: In opening the meeting, the President referred to the tendency for those involved in attending meetings and dealing with the day by day activities of their organisations to come to regard them as a mere routine, and so miss the sense of satisfaction and happiness that comes from a job well done. "Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with all thy might".

MINUTES of the previous meeting, held on 1st August 1978, having been circulated, were taken as read and confirmed with the following amendments:-

- p.1 BUSINESS ARISING: for A.C.C. Constitution read A.C.C. Structures.
p.2 FINANCE: Overseas Conferences Fund - delete the paragraph as printed and substitute the following:-

"The fund stands at \$510.31 with an additional \$500 just received; our observer's fare will be about \$1400. It was agreed that local churchwomen's groups be encouraged to contribute \$1 each to the fund; any amounts received in excess of our requirements for fares to be forwarded to A.C.W.C. to assist with delegates' expenses".

Sarah is teaching on the staff of a High School in Apia and is much involved in the women's activities in her own village. She had expressed her grateful thanks to A.C.W. for the opportunity given her as a Scholarship holder and sent greetings and good wishes to the Working Committee and to A.C.W. members generally.

Special Days. Heather Stevens advised that the Queensland Unit, who have undertaken the preparation of the World Community Day Service for 1979, would like information on the Theme when it has been decided. After discussion, it was agreed that the Theme would be "The Family - its Faith and its Future".

Publicity. As preparations are in hand for the production of A.C.W. and F.L.C. Leaflets, it was agreed that State Units be requested to advise us as to the numbers of each required by them and whether they feel that other publicity material is needed. Joan Curtin reported that the September issue of "Women at Work" would include special reference to the forthcoming A.C.W.C. Assembly.
