BOOK REVIEW - Helen Woolcott

I suppose most of us have seen the film "A Man Called Peter", at least once or twice. It is a regular event on TV. But having also read Catherine Marshall's book, I sometimes wonder what had happened to Peter Marshall's widow and son after his death in 1949.

Facing a lonely future, Catherine Marshall was challenged to write, and produced nearly twenty books. One of the last before she died in 1983, was MEETING GOD AT EVERY TURN.

Following ten years of widowhood, Catherine married a widower with three children, and her thus "adopted" daughter, Linda LeSourd, urged her to write "what she had learned about God and His plan for life and for families". The result is a personal and moving book of twelve easy-to-read episodes in MEETING GOD AT EVERY TURN.

The twelve key points in the book are some which face most of us during our lives, and are times when God can provide special care and guidance for us. These include, Illness, Grief, Single Parenthood, Loneliness, Second Families and Grandparenting.

Not all the experiences are unhappy, and there are delightful sections of joy and laughter in the book as well. But she writes: "I have met God at moments when the straight roads turn. He has picked me up, wiped away the tears, and set me back on the path of life".

From childhood to old age, Catherine Marshall has "met God at every turn", and she finally wrote this book to share her experiences and God's goodness with her readers.
