Agendas help to give form to a gathering and enables business to be attended to in an ordered way. Most necessary!!

The gospel¹ reading that was set down for last Sunday was the story of a Samaritan traveller and his act of kindness and compassion. In thinking about this very well known parable one asks what new thing can be said. The story seems to need no explanation!

As I thought about it (with, I guess, my experience of the past week still fresh in my mind), I came to the conclusion that this could be a story about agendas.

There was the Innkeeper. He ran a respectable business, not a hospital - and he certainly wasn't about to take in some foreigner! What would his regular customers think? Each person in this story had his own agenda

Then there was the Levite! He was in a hurry! Those roads were dangerous. He wasn't about to put himself at risk. He had important business to attend to, so he hurried by.

And the priest? He had just had a wonderful time of serving in the temple. He was so enveloped in the experience of God's presence, and he was not going to allow anything to break the bubble. So he, too, hurried by.

And the wounded traveller still lay by the side of the road!

Daily we need to ask, "Whose agenda am I following? Mine --- or God's? Jesus said, "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, soul, and strength. And you must love your neighbour as yourself."

Sometimes we are so caught up in what we believe to be "God's Business" that we fail to see the wounded traveller by the side of the road.

May I encourage you to be women whose lives are governed by a deep and abiding awareness that it is God's agenda which is important.

God's agenda is one of love and compassion and grace and HOPE.

"As often as you have done it for one of these you have done it for me!"

EXTRACT FROM A LETTER FROM LT. COL. LYNETTE GREEN IN KENYA

The following was printed in the Victorian Unit's April Newsletter: -

"Last Tuesday we went out on the final feeding distribution for the famine relief. It has been going for 6 months. Originally it was to go for 3 months, but thanks to the generosity of people from around the world we had enough to extend for another 3 months. The families have a registration card and they know when the trucks will come and they are all there waiting when the

truck comes in. They line up in an orderly fashion – mamas on one line and papas on the other and on production of the card they get maize, beans and oil. It would probably last most people 3 days to a week, but this has to last a month. They are so grateful. We have a team of younger Salvationists who handle the physical side of loading trucks and unloading and going on the distribution runs. They have built up a rapport with the people and it has been good for both sides. It is sad to see about one hundred people sitting under a tree a little way away from the truck. They do not have cards and they are waiting for any left overs. As it happened they had some remaining parcels this time, but 20 families missed out. Running parallel to the family feeding programme which has fed 15,000 families per month, we have the schools feeding programme. This started out to feed 19,000 children every school day with a meal of porridge. The same amount of food is now feeding 50,000 children every school day. What has happened is that school attendance has increased because of the feeding programme. In fact the attendance has increased by 37%. Teachers are writing to us and saying how much they appreciated the feeding programme because it means they can now teach the children instead of the little dears going to sleep from hunger. One school has had the best results for year 8 for some time and they attribute this to the feeding programme. We have the promise of enough money to keep that programme going until the end of the year. We have 399 Salvation Army schools and this feeding programme is covering all of them. By the end of the year we will have distributed 1,500 metric tons of food."
