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SUNDAY SCHOOL ANNUAL REPORT, 1983

During 1983 the Sunday School had 14 pupils on the roll, of which 10 attended regularly. The average attendance was 57 per cent.

The kindergarten had 15 pupils on the roll with an average attendance of 75 per cent.

During the year we welcomed Joan Stokes and Ian McLure to Kindergarten teaching staff.

We also welcomed Toni Sheppard back at the beginning of the year, after her examinations.

The prize-giving was held at the Family Service in March, instead of February. With Harvest Festival being held on the third Sunday in February, it was felt that March would be the better time for prize-giving.

We held Family Fun Nights in March, June and October, which were all successful. At the October Fun Night, parents and the teachers were encouraged to join in the games. As well as the more energetic type of game, checkers, dominoes and other table games were provided.

The Annual Family Picnic was held on Saturday, 24th September at Centennial Park.

The Annual Vestry Meeting was held on Monday, 19th at 7.30 p.m. In the absence of the Rector, the Rural Dean of Mar-
 rickville, Rev. Gerald Beckett, chaired the meeting.

The Treasurer's Reports were accepted and approved without dissension. Parish income increased over the year but was still behind expenditure. This in spite of generous donations from Church bodies and continuous effort on the recycling program, which returned \$5,320. The falling attendance was reflected in an increase in offertories of only \$200.
