

Dear Friends,

In a few weeks we will be celebrating Easter. Sunday 19th April being Easter Day. Do take note of the service times over Easter and make a point of joining in our celebrations.

Easter is the important season in the Christian Year. Easter reminds us of the Death and Resurrection of Christ. The sinless Son of God died and rose again that we sinners might be restored to fellowship with God.

The whole foundation of our christian faith is based on the fact that Jesus of Nazareth died on the cross and three days later rose to life. St Paul writing to the Church at Corinth says - "if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain" (1 Corinthians 15: 14)

What is it that Christians believe?

Firstly that Jesus of Nazareth was no ordinary man. He was both God and man. Born of the Virgin Mary but conceived by the Holy Ghost. He was, and throughout his life continued to be, the sinless Son of God.

Secondly the crucifixion of Jesus was unwarranted as he had committed no crime. There was another purpose in his death. That purpose being to achieve for us sinners forgiveness. "He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness." (1 Peter 2: 24)

Thirdly, there are from time to time heroic acts. A father may save his child from drowning yet lose his own life in the attempt. This and other situations are examples where a life is sacrificed so that another

person may live, but there are two distinct differences about the death of Jesus Christ.

Jesus not only died for us. Thereby paying for our sin, but He died and on the third day rose again to life. Through his sinless life he had gained the victory over both sin and death. He lives. Yes he died but he overcame death and lives.

When a person sacrifices his, or her life for another, no matter how brave that act may be, the saved person is given back their earthly existence. When Jesus died he gave us eternal life.

On the third day he rose. He had triumphed over death and the grave. Better still that victory he is willing to share with us mere mortals. He not only paid the price of our sin by hanging on the cross he also gives eternal life to all who put their faith in him.

Easter is the time of great celebration. Jesus has given to all who put their trust in him life, a life that the world cannot take from us and a sure hope for the future.

Come and celebrate with us this Easter.

THE SCRIPTURE UNION METHOD OF READING THE BIBLE.

It is no good having a brand new Bible, the very best method, a warm study and everything else, unless right deep down you are ready to obey what God says to you through His Word. It isn't just a history book, describing things that happened in the dim distant past; it isn't just a book of rules for you to keep if you can; it is the Word of your Heavenly Father, and it comes to you from Him as a personal friend; if you read it like this you will be continually surprised at the way in which it "fits" your needs and answers your problems.

- 1. PRAY** before reading each day's Bible passage. Ask God to teach you so that you may understand what you read, and that it may be helpful to you. The Scripture Union prayer is "Open thou my eyes, that I may behold wonderous things out of thy law" (Psalm 119: 18)
- 2. READ** the passage for the day carefully and thoughtfully.
- 3. MEDITATE** when you have read the Bible passage, see if you can find answers to the following questions:
 1. What have I read about God - the Father, Son or Holy Spirit?
 2. Is there any example for me to follow?
 3. Is there a command for me to obey?
 4. Is there a promise for me to rely on?
 5. What is the main lesson of the passage?
- 4. PRAY** again over the thoughts that have come from your reading and meditation.


