

MOORE COLLEGE: BROUGHTON PAPERS

Broughton to Mrs Broughton, 30/11/1847 (Duntroon)

My dear Sally: Your last Letter which Mr James forwarded to me at Yass gave me very great satisfaction and happiness as it informed me of the so much better health of our little grandson. Indeed I hope that through God's blessing he may by this time be restored to health. I am now writing from Charles (or more properly speaking I believe George Campbell's place) to which I came this morning. This day week I left Captn Rossi's and went to Mr Edinborough's where I slept: next day to Gunning where Mr Cartwright lives: Thursday to Yass. Saturday I went to dine and sleep at Mr O'Brien's: and went in to Church on Sunday with Mrs O'B who expressed herself in very kind terms respecting you, and desired to be remembered to you when I wrote. Sunday evening I went to Mr Hume's near Yass where I slept; and yesterday came on to Mr Palmer's with whom and his daughter I have just arrived here. The post goes from Queanbeyan tomorrow: and there is barely time for me to write these few lines before they send in the letters: as they are 7 miles from the post office, I think it better however to send this to say that I am quite well, as I shall be out of reach of the post all next week: and you might wonder at not hearing from me. Give my most affectionate love to the dear girls and to W.B. & say how truly I rejoice with him and Phoebe that their Child is so much better.
