

Archbishop's 1990 Overseas Relief and Aid Appeal Message

Dear Friends,

For those called to live and travel with Jesus during his years of public ministry on earth, one of the most inspiring aspects of his life was his compassion for those in need.

On a number of occasions, the Gospels identify compassion as the reason that Jesus healed someone or fed the crowds following him. Indeed, on one occasion Jesus himself uses the compassion to describe his reaction to the crowds and his motive for action to meet their need.

For the Apostle Paul, then, one of the natural expressions of Christ's life at work in the Christian, was compassion - that sensitivity to the needs of others which moves us to living action and to sharing ourselves and our resources.

The Overseas Relief and Aid Appeal gives all the opportunity to express practically and generously the compassion we feel for those in desperate need overseas.

It is a chance to sustain Christians at work meeting the needs of the poor overseas in the context of witness to Christ's Gospel.

THIS MONTH'S MISSION.

Each month our missionary giving goes to the support of a particular mission. During November and December that mission will be the Anglican Home Mission Society.

Here are some facts about H.M.S. (Anglican Home Mission Society).

The Society is one of the largest agencies of its kind with over 1,000 specialist staff employed in more than 100 services in Sydney and Wollongong.

In the Diocese's growth areas HMS assists parishes in the task of evangelism and outreach via financial support of clergy, parish, youth and cross-cultural workers. In some situations the Society provides administrative assistance with church building projects.

Last year it administered grants totalling \$1.1 million for the support of 58 people in 50 parishes.

Poverty is no longer confined to the inner-city. The traditional poor, which the Society has dealt with for more than 134 years is being replaced by the "new poor"; people over-committed to debt and choked by the rent or mortgage nightmare.

HMS, through its welfare division, Careforce, operates financial counselling programmes and emergency material aid.

On Sunday 25th November you will be able to hear more about this work from a representative of the Society who will be our guest preacher at the morning service.

ANNUAL FETE

17TH NOVEMBER

9 AM TO 2 PM

ADVENT.

Two Comings of Christ we confess in the Creeds. We declare our acceptance of the First Coming as a fact of history; and we declare our faith in the Second as a sure and certain hope. Also, in the season of Advent the Collect, which our Prayer Book provides to be used daily speaks of (1) 'the time of this mortal life in which Thy Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility', and (2) 'the last day, when He shall come again in His glorious Majesty to judge both the quick and the dead'.

Let us consider both how different and how complementary these two Comings are. Together they provide the fulfillment of God's purposes, and God's full answer to the needs of man in his world.

(1) Christ came the first time in mercy and grace to save. 'God commendeth His love towards us in that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us.' (2) He will come the second time in righteousness and truth to judge. It is part of the Gospel that by this same Jesus Christ, who came to save men, God will judge men. 'Because He hath appointed a day, in which He will judge the world in righteousness by that Man whom He hath ordained.'

(1) He came in humility and in the form of a servant - 'incognito, unrecognized, a man of sorrows, despised, rejected. He had not where to lay His head. It says of His enemies, 'And they laid their hands on Him and took Him'; and of His friends, 'And they all forsook Him and fled'; (2) He shall come in power and great glory, with attendant angels, with the manifested majesty of God. 'And every eye shall see Him.' No one will then be able to disown or disregard Him. At the Name of Jesus every knee shall bow; and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord.

Christ's Second Coming is a subject either of supreme joy or supreme terror. It can be a supreme joy, but only if we are already by faith appropriating the benefits of his first Coming, and living our hope set on His Second Coming.
