Minutes of Council Meeting Monday 17th June 2013 held at 222 Pitt St Sydney

WELCOME: President Isabel Hewitt welcomed all especially President Elect Natalie McLeod who shared some of her story with the group. Isabel welcomed Margaret Brumby from the Burwood/Concord/ Strathfield Branch.

DEVOTIONS: A devotional piece in keeping with Refugee Week, based on the Beatitudes, was read by Isabel.

Minutes of AGM held on 15th April 2013 were passed to be initialled on the motion of Janice Willis and Helen Hill.

CONFIRMATION of MINUTES of the Council meeting held on Monday 15th April were confirmed on the motion of Lyn Middleton and Jan Jeffrey.

BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES:

1. Dedication Day Hamilton Wesley Uniting 20th May. – comments: Katalina was an excellent speaker. People enjoyed the journey to Newcastle. Isabel expressed her thanks to those who gave support in attendance and with the catering. Thanks were offered to Isabel for the arrangements for the day. Offering \$432. 20.
2. NSW as Incoming National 2013-2015. Lyn reported that there was to be a meeting after Council to discuss matters that need to be decided at this stage. Deposit has been placed on the Conference Venue for 2015. Passed by those present at the Council Meeting.
3. National Conference WA 7th -11th October. *Honouring Australian Church Women* nominations Heather Badgery and Beryl Kirkwood. These were confirmed on the motion of Heather Reid and Jennifer Peffer. Further investigation into *Honours, Death, and Motions to be presented*.
4. Visit of Esther Kilagbhan Friday 18th October 2013. This is to be a social outing. Please note date in diary.
5. Spiritual Enrichment Day and 75th Anniversary Monday 16th September 2013. Flyers were available, indicating a speaker, Jenny Stanger from *Project Samaritan*, Special Days Project for 2013. Members of NSW Council will be allocated duties. Cost \$30. [Morning tea and lunch] Time: 9.30 am concluding before 3 pm.
6. Rae Goth was presented with her badge as a member of NSW Executive.

REPORTS: TREASURER: Helen Richardson gave bank balance for April and May 2013 as \$ 9454.97 with many payments: postage of Newsette; for Annual Report; donation to Hamilton Wesley Uniting Church. National Conference expenses for President, Secretary, Treasurer and President Elect as the voting persons and observers as set out in Guidelines to be met. Helen moved that the report be received and approval for the accounts to be paid. Seconded by Jennifer Peffer. Passed.

FELLOWSHIP of the LEAST COIN: Lillian Hodges has spoken at The Salvation Army at Parramatta and the Richmond Uniting Church and to go to Boronia Park Uniting Church at Hunters Hill at end of June. Lillian shared the story of sensitisation workshops as arranged in Gambia. Women there are now much better informed about their legal rights and responsibilities and the use of legal aid when required. As FLC monies had supported these workshops, the women were informed about FLC and encouraged to take part in an FLC offertory at the prayer meetings. Lillian shared a devotional segment from Fiji.

ASIAN CHURCH WOMEN'S CONFERENCE: Isabel asked that prayerful consideration be given to the role and responsibilities for this executive position. There will be a quadrennial conference to which a delegate may be sent. Prayer partners Mongolia and Timor were remembered.

SPECIAL DAYS: Lyn Middleton said that the Fellowship Day materials had been sent out. There are some spare copies to be taken. World Community Day copy has been received and will be ready for distribution at the August Council Meeting. This is prepared by the Victorian Unit. *Love is for Sharing* being the theme. Lyn gave out the scripture readings associated with this service and reminded all that the Special Project for 2013, is *Project Samaritan*.

WINIFRED KIEK SCHOLARSHIP: Judith Cayzer promoted the book *Winifred* and the leaflet regarding the current scholars.

SOCIAL ISSUES: Rae Goth gave detailed accounts of issues from Alcohol Induced Violence, new mums returning to work, and harassment of women in the Defence Forces. Reports were prepared as hand out with addresses of the politicians to whom comments should be directed.

Bible Society, National Council of Women [NCW], Pan Pacific and South East Asian Women's Association [PPASEAWA], had no reports.


ANY OTHER BUSINESS: Prayer was requested for Dame Monica Gallagher with the suggestion she be contacted as she is far from well.
