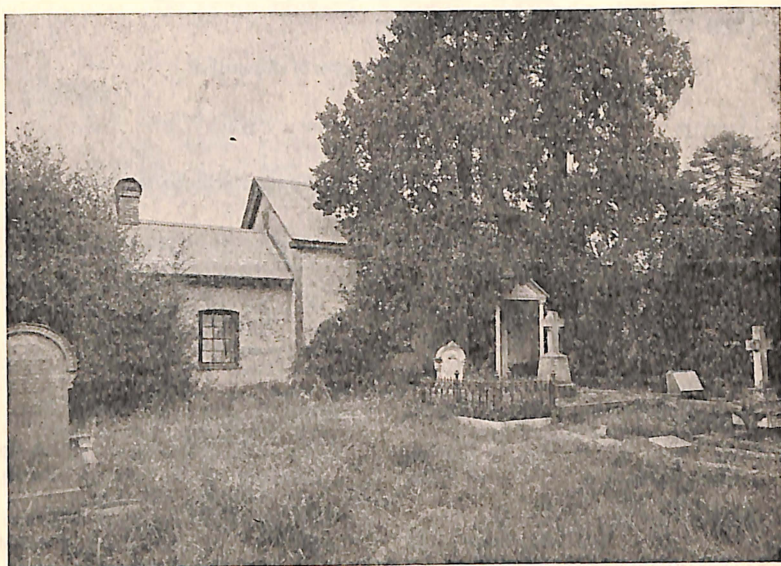

HEBER CHAPEL AND HEBER CHAPEL SCHOOL

(First entry: Holy Baptism, 1st April, 1827)



The Chapel was at first simply "the School House." In that School House the services of the Church of England were conducted and the Christian Ministry of the Parish began.

HISTORICAL NOTE

Mr. Thomas Hobbles Scott, M.A., took Holy Orders in England and received an appointment in the Diocese of Durham. Later he was created Archdeacon of New South Wales; his Archdeaconry was placed in the Diocese of Calcutta, India, of which the Rt. Rev. Reginald Heber was bishop.

Archdeacon Hobbles arrived in Sydney on May 7, 1825. During the latter years of the above archdeaconate the Rev. Thomas Hassell, M.A., came to Cobbitty and there being no place of worship in the neighbourhood did here what he had done in O'Connell Plains, N.S.W., where he had erected the Salem Chapel; he built here this chapel (Heber) dedicated by the Rev. Samuel Marsden, M.A., on November 30, 1828. The Rev. Thomas Hassell erected this humble place of worship as a memorial of a saintly man, Reginald Heber, Bishop of Calcutta, and this building, which is the connecting link with that period of the Church's history, stands as the only memorial to mark that connection, and is a memorial to a great spiritually-minded man.
