Olive worked as a Secretary, and later worked for 20 years at Sydney Rescue Work (now Integrecare) as a Pay Mistress and Confidante to staff whilst supporting her husband in pastoral ministry.

After marriage they attended Stanmore Baptist, and when transferred to Bathurst with work, they were committed to Bathurst Baptist Church. A move, back to Sydney, several years later to Haberfield.
