THE RECTOR'S LETTER

All Saints' Rectory,

31st October, 1949.

Dear People of All Saints',

The simplicity and beauty of "The Order of Confirmation" are always impressive, and this year they were no less so. Bishop Pilcher was particularly pleased with the service, and in praising the Choirmaster and the Choir for their devotional rendering of it, made special reference to the atmosphere created by the singing (as an act of worship) of Foster's appropriate anthem, "O for a Closer Walk with God." It certainly was a beautiful service, to which the candidates themselves made their contribution by their attentive and reverent bearing. We thank the Bishop for his addresses, the text chosen this year being the words of St. Paul in 2 Timothy 1:8, "Be not thou therefore ashamed of the testimony of our Lord," and we feel sure the Confirmees will ever be able to look back upon their Confirmation with joy and thankfulness.

We commend these young people to you, hoping that you will not only remember them in your prayers, but, that where it is possible you will get to know them and help them in every way you can to be true to the promises they have made in their Confirmation. This Christian way of life to which we are all called is no easy thing—it is a constant struggle which calls forth the best that is in us; but we know that Christianity not only sets before us high ideals, but also offers us the Power to attain to them. God does not ask us to fight in our own strength.


November will be a very busy month. On November 13th, we have our Children's Festival Service, when we hope that many parents will be sufficiently interested in their children and in the Sunday School, to be present at the eleven o'clock service on that day.

His Excellency, the Governor, Lieutenant-General J. Northcott, has kindly consented to unveil our Parish War Memorial on Sunday morning, November 20th. The Memorial is now in course of erection, and we should be grateful if all promises and gifts for the fund could be paid in at once.

On Advent Sunday evening, November 27th, the gifts in memory of my dear sister, Ethel Vivian Adams, for Educational Missionary Work in the Diocese of Central Tanganyika, will be received and offered by the Rev. Canon R. J. Hewett, Federal Secretary of C.M.S. As you probably know, it is the Women's Guild's desire to raise an additional £100 for the Missionary work of the Church in memory of their late President, who was instrumental in raising this amount for the five years prior to her death. I am very grateful to the Guild, for I am certain she would wish no finer memorial.

We hope to have a day of continuous prayer for the Missionary work of the Church on the eve of Saint Andrew's Day, commencing with a celebration of Holy Communion at 7.30 a.m., and concluding with Evensong at 5.30 p.m. If you would like to join in this Day of Prayer on November 29th, will you please put your name down for the period you will be available, so that the continuity of prayer may be preserved throughout the day.

HOLY COMMUNION AND THE RECENTLY CONFIRMED

You will remember that during the period of instruction the importance of, and the necessity for **REGULAR** attendance at Holy Communion was particularly stressed. Read again the Second Exhortation in the Communion Service, which is based on St. Luke, chapter fourteen, verses sixteen to twenty-five.

The fact that the first Sunday in each month has been suggested as "Your Day," does not mean that you may come **only** on the Sunday assigned you. You are welcome to come as frequently as you desire; and you should always be present at the Great Festivals of the Church's year, but **you should never allow your attendance at Holy Communion to become less frequent than once a month.**

You were confirmed on the twentieth Sunday after Trinity, and the opening words of the Epistle for that Sunday (Ephesians V, 15, 16) are very appropriate: "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil." These words have been rendered in a modern translation: "Be strictly careful then about the life you lead; act like sensible men not like thoughtless; make the very most of your time, for these are evil days." The Bishop's text (2 Timothy 1, 8): "Be not thou therefore ashamed of the testimony of our Lord," reminds us that in our Baptism we were signed with the Sign of the Cross in token that hereafter we "shall not be ashamed to confess the Faith of Christ crucified . . ." We can adapt the prayer from the Confirmation Service and pray: "Strengthen us, O God, with the power of Thy Holy Spirit, that we may continue Thine for ever, and daily increase in Thy heavenly grace more and more . . ."
