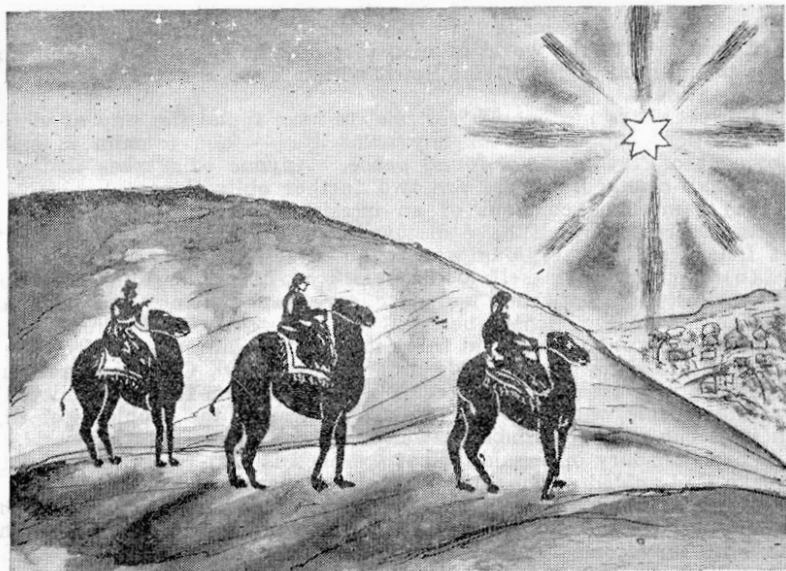

## THE RECTOR'S NOTES

Dear Friends,

In the middle of November it was a joy to share in the celebration of Mrs. Kent's (of Sadlier Crescent) attaining her 100th birthday. There is no doubt about that being a very special occasion and on behalf of the people at All Saints' I offer to her and her daughter, who cares for her mother, our warmest greetings and congratulations.

November also saw the occasion of the Annual Fete. Many laboured long and hard for this function and it is good to be able to say that it was a success. Congratulations to Mr. Bill Williams who was the Fete Chairman and all those others who worked so hard. Of course we want to say a special thanks to those who came and supported the workers by spending at the stalls as well. There was a particular point for me personally—some parishioners of All Saints' Oatley West, where my wife and I served some seventeen years ago, came and ran the Fruit and Vegetables Stall for us. It was a lovely gesture and we are very grateful. It was also very nice to have the help of two of my son's friends from Eastwood—they helped him in 'guarding' the property during the night of Friday prior to the Fete, though they looked a little the worse for it the next day I must say!

This coming month is one of 'specials' — all related to the Christmas Festival. We look forward to having the fellowship of many of you at those special occasions. Christmas has an appeal all its own. But we miss the real spirit of Christmas very often in the excitement of the festivities. The message of this time of the year is the hope of becoming 'new men for a new world'.

"You can never change the world merely by changing individuals" says the disillusioned cynic. But there is nothing surer than that we'll never have a new world without new people. And something must take place in their lives to make them new. Christmas with the story of the Christ coming into the world of men to renew hope and ideals and aims points to the need of the Divine Spirit within if we are to experience the "new creation".

However it is not enough for 'me' to have found the way of victory over conflicts and defeats of 'my own' life — and remain in selfish enjoyment of 'my' new — found peace. Anyone who takes that view is only half-changed. There are two further obligations:—

(a) I must be conscious of an irresistible impulse to help others find the secret I myself have discovered. If that impulse is not present I have still a very long way to go myself!

(b) I must give myself to the overthrow of evil customs, traditions and systems which entrench and encourage wrong values and make the good life harder than it need be.

Evil is not only a personal thing it is also socialised—and I must see to it that I take my place beside other transformed, Christ-inspired men and women who are seeking to create a better system for community life.

Only people who have found God's answer to the problems of their own lives can discover God's answer for the problems of the world.

Lord Salisbury once said "What we need is God-guided personalities to make God-guided nationalities to make a new world".

May this Christmas be a blessing for each and every one of us that we might 'see' Him and His message of encouragement and hope—that indeed He may come to dwell in our hearts by faith—and shed abroad in our lives His own redeeming love for all men.

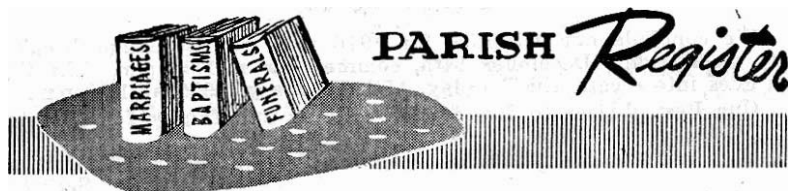
