



Dear Friends,

So often we hear people say, "Things haven't changed". I guess it all depends what they are commenting about. We sometimes say it in disgust, or sometimes with sense of security.

In disgust we comment; "Things haven't changed". In a world where there is so much progress; many areas unfortunately show no improvement: People haven't changed their attitudes to others; to the poor, to the outcast, to the stranger, to the newcomer.

To some the lack of change means that they find themselves secure somewhere in a world in which progress meant change. Change is threatening to many people, and often we are all tempted to withdraw from real life into our own secure isolation.

To others the statement "Things haven't changed" is an important statement. Many things have changed in the style of worship in our churches - new versions of the Bible, many of the hymns are different, styles of preaching have changed - however the basic truth of the Christian faith has not changed.

Those truths can be summarized.

- 1) "All (men and women) have sinned and come short of God's standard"
- 2) "Jesus bore our sin in His body on the tree."
- 3) "Believe in the Lord Jesus and you shall be saved."

These facts haven't changed and for this we praise God. The believer has no fear of the future; no fear that past errors will prevent him or her finding peace and eternal life with God.

"Things haven't changed" - not when it comes to matters of eternity.

Man's need is the same - God's love is the same - those who are honest with God are secure, but those who lie to themselves and to God continue to be without hope and peace.

This is why many say "Things haven't changed" - the message of the Christian church is always the same. Praise God! that it is, otherwise there would be no hope for us sinners.

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

The electric motor driving the air system to the organ has burnt out and a replacement motor is now being investigated. We have had very good service from the old motor as it has been in use for more than sixty years.

The pillar to the gate at the Church Street entrance has again been bashed by a vehicle. Ray Swankie & Fred Evans have straightened it up & plans are afoot to put in protective steel posts on the street side of the pillars.

REPAIRS TO QUATREFOILS AT APEX OF ROOF

Repairs to these are being organised as an emergency. The Parish Council has been aware for some time that the glass panels had slipped and the wind could blow through freely. It has now become a matter of importance in that friendly pigeons have taken up residence in the church and are making a mess of it.

Because there is no point in trying to get rid of the birds whilst they can come and go at will, the Church wardens have arranged to seal off these openings as an urgent matter. In the meantime our cleaning programme is halted and church cleaning will be done on Saturday so that there is the minimum of time left for the pigeons to soil it.

We hope that by the time this paragraph appears in the Chronicle the matter will be resolved. This is where our money goes.
