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
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
QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

AUSTRALIAN CHURCH WOMEN came into being in 1965, uniting the existing State Women's Inter-Church Councils prepared to share common tasks, and undertake united action. Australian Church Women forms a network of committed Christian women, dedicated to encourage fellowship and service across denominational, national and international boundaries.

FELLOWSHIP OF THE LEAST COIN OFFERINGS are brought from individuals and groups to be dedicated at the World Community Day Service in October. These are then sent to the Treasurer of your State Unit.

THE OFFERING from this service is to be divided equally between our 1990 Winifred Kiek Scholar, teacher Doreen Tie, for supplies for a Toy Library and Resource Centre for the School for Mentally Retarded Children in Kuching, Sarawak; and Administrative Funds for Asian Church Women's Conference, of which Australian Church Women is a member organisation.

An Ecumenical Fellowship-Meal may be held before or after the World Community Day Service. The Discussion Questions on Page 7 may be used during the Service as indicated, or as part of a Seminar/Discussion Group.

Students of local schools may be invited to participate in the World Community Day Service. They may provide a choir to sing "The Lord's Prayer."

Leader We pray for those whose beliefs and attitudes are different to ours;
for people of other faiths, for new settlers to whom our culture is
strange, and for aboriginal communities seeking to regain their
identity.

People **Grant us discernment that we may be freed from blind
prejudice and may strive to understand their needs. May they
see in us, who are your ambassadors, the image of your love.**

Leader We pray for people damaged by experiences of violence, cruelty,
deprivation or neglect, for those who have suffered physical or
emotional abuse and for those who abuse.

People **May they be cleansed of the burden of fear, bitterness and
resentment and learn to know the healing power of love.**

Leader We pray for those whose lives have lost their meaning - the lonely and the unemployed. We pray, too, for those who have lost their way and have sought escape in drugs or empty pleasures, or meaning in cults and dangerous practices.

People **May they be led to you, the source of all meaning, and find in you hope, forgiveness and reconciliation, and the way, the truth and the life.**

All **Lord, make us instruments of your peace,
Where there is hatred, let us sow love,
Where there is injury, pardon,
Where there is doubt, faith,
Where there is despair, hope,
Where there is darkness, light
Where there is sadness, joy.
All these things we ask in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.
