Australian Church Women (ACW)

Australian Church Women was established in 1965 when women's interchurch councils from all states and territories came together to form Australian Church Women, fostering ecumenism and undertaking action on behalf of the churches. Australian Church Women forms a network of committed Christian women dedicated to encourage fellowship and service across denominational, national and international boundaries.

Fellowship of the Least Coin (FLC)

FLC monies, which have been collected during prayer for peace and reconciliation throughout the past year, are brought to World Community Day Services by groups and individuals and dedicated. These funds are then sent to State/Territory Treasurers who forward them to the National Treasurer of Australian Church Women.

Asian Church Women's Conference (ACWC)

The General Offering from today's Service will be divided between ACWC and the 2006 Special Day Project. Australian Church Women is affiliated with the Asian Church Women's Conference and helps to support this Christian women's organisation.

2006 Special Day Project

The 'Merrijig' Centre—the Catholic Church operates this support service for families living with alcohol and drug addiction. 'Merrijig' has applied for funding to support the running costs of their drop-in centre.

Order of Service

Welcome and Greetings:

Psalm 105:1–4 (NIV)

Give thanks to the LORD, call on his name;
make known among the nations what he has done.
Sing to him, sing praise to him;
tell of all his wonderful acts.
Glory in his holy name;
let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice.
Look to the LORD and his strength;
seek his face always.

Prayer of Celebration (responsive):

Leader: Lord God we have come to worship you.

Response: *We celebrate and rejoice together.*

Leader: Yet Lord, we come reverently for you are a holy God, who desires justice and truth.

Response: *We place our trust in you and thank you, the Living God, for you are faithful and unchanging.*

Leader: We praise you as the creator and giver of life. We thank you that you provide for all our needs. We humans take our place amongst the created order and join in the chorus of praise.

Response: *We rejoice that you call us by name. We are your people.*

Leader: From generation to generation throughout this earth your majesty and mercy is recognised. We, who gather here, are only a small part of your world wide community. Help us to remember that your presence is found everywhere in this world.

Response: *We add our voices of praise to that of others ...*

Leader: We want to glorify your name, to bear witness that you are our God and Lord of our lives. We bless you as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Response: *We declare our adoration and praise. Thank you Lord, that you hear and answer prayer. Amen.*

Prayer of Confession (responsive):

Leader: Loving God:
