Dear Friends,

From time to time we look at the church and question its future. The answer to our question will be determined by our understanding of the nature of the church.

To some a church is no more than a beautiful arrangement of bricks, glass, wood, a bit of stone and iron work. Its architect may have been so clever that the building gives an impression of standing forever.

To question the future of the church when one is only referring to a building, is simply to ask how long will it continue to be usable. All buildings have only a limited life.

If one sees the church as the congregation that meets within its walls, then one is asking an entirely different question. In a young country like Australia we have experienced the folding up, or the amalgamation of congregations. They cease to exist for several reasons. A church can die from within because its members have no sense of witnessing to others. Sometimes a whole population may move, e.g., a gold mine in some remote part of the country may just close down and all the population leave.

If the congregation in a particular place is the church then we must acknowledge that the future existence of a church depends upon spiritual zeal or population movements.

From God's Word we gain a different view of the church. It has an everlasting nature. The true church does not depend on a building, or a group of people meeting in that building. The true church is linked to God Himself through the cross of Jesus Christ. It is the company of believers. Most gather in a building with others, but they may equally be isolated for long periods of time.

The future of the church is secure - secure not in this world only, but in all eternity.

As Christians our chief concern is not for the building, or even that a particular group might continue to worship in the same way, in the same place for ever. Our chief concern is that others may enjoy fellowship with the Lord, the joy of sins forgiven, and the security of eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The church may outwardly appear weak and divided, even declining but this is not the truth. The true church is living and growing as year by year men and women come to find Jesus Christ as their Saviour and Lord.

"Those whom the Father shall give me none shall pluck out of my hand" John 10: 29.

PARISH HALL DOOR


