READER 3. I am coloured, and my community hates me for it. I am torn between hatred of those who despise me, and a compensatory super-view of myself. Why can't I be allowed to live as a person, instead of a symbol of racism?

READER 4. My husband is a prosperous executive, but seldom has time for me. My family don't hear me, and I continually fight loneliness and boredom. My time is filled with an apparently meaningless search - for I don't know what!

READER 5. I represent the East Caribbean, the Pacific Islands or the African States. I feel within me an ability to rise above my circumstances, but to whom shall I look for strength and encouragement?

Lord, we pray today for all who feel down-trodden-socially, mentally, physically. May they learn to accept what is inevitable, and find courage to change what is unjust, or contrary to Your law of Love.

PAUSE

We pray for all who feel within themselves the power to improve their lot. May they claim Your wisdom in their struggle for a better life.

PAUSE

We pray for those who have decisions to make which will affect others. May Your grace be evident in their deliberations.

PAUSE

RESPONSE. THE CONGREGATION WILL STAND.

THE WORD SPEAKS: Luke 12: 42-48  
Luke 21: 1-4

What are our Responsibilities?

every opportunity for further study or learning, in order  
to have more to share. Give us a desire to be well infomed,  
so that we may be more aware of the needs of the world.*

LEADER: Lord, we see those who struggle to find their own identity, both in our own community, and in the developing countries.

PEOPLE: *Lord, we recognise our responsibility. We know that each individual is of infinite worth to You, and that with Your life within, each person is able to develop into a powerful force for Your kingdom. LEADER'S INFORMATION SHEET

WOMEN SEEK OPPORTUNITIES FOR ACTION

Changes in the approach for Community Day Programmes are possible and stimulating.

... seek to help you try new ways! These are our suggestions to increase interest  
... the gathering of women in a common cause, for your local action.

- a) A pattern has been given for the Service we suggest your group may like to try one of the other ideas which incorporate the theme.
- b) DISCUSSION GROUPS could be introduced within the time used for the Service. You would need to prepare for these by arrangement of seating and group leaders.

Using the Service - Discussion Group Time

- i) Following "Freedom and Fulfillment" and "The Discovery".

DISCUSSION TOPICS

As we think of the problems presented by each of the Readers, ponder on possible solutions to their questions.

1. What is ahead for the weary, hopeless victim of the inner-suburban syndrome? Is there any hope for her? Can we as Christian women help in any way? What challenge for us is there to care enough to help? Prayer is not enough.
2. The Asian is surrounded by fear, pain and mistrust. What would be her attitude to us - condemnatory, incredulous or envious? Do we have a responsibility to those who have suffered because of war or pestilence? If so, what responsible action can be taken by our group? Now and in our local community.
3. The coloured speaker reveals an honest spirit in this case - are we equally frank about our relations with the coloured world? Have we shown superior attitudes to any representative of a different culture? How can we, in our suburb, extend our acceptance?
4. Is there a task facing the local church in meeting the needs of frustrated house-wives? In what ways can Christ-orientated women show His love to those who are surrounded by unhappiness, real or imaginary?
5. As men and women of the developing countries discover in themselves a longing to extend their horizons, can a group of Christians in this land offer any practical help?

ii) Following "The presentation of Offerings"

DISCUSSION TOPICS

LEADER - We recognise that there are other needs in the world for which we have some responsibility. We feel inspired to give of ourselves sacrificially in order to help our brothers and sisters in Christ.

RESPONSE - We pledge ourselves to support the Christmas Bowl Appeal in gratitude for the blessings we have received, and in acknowledgement of our membership of Christ's world-wide family.

(Information on the Project which will be supported by the Christmas Bowl Appeal should be given here.)

If a Discussion Period is planned instead of the Sermon on the topic - Freedom and Fulfillment - the following questions could be used.

1. Are there many people who do not hope for something better than their present life?
2. The statement by Rev. John R. Claypool - All that lives beyond our experience in history, is our personal spirit. Do you think this would be meaningful to a fearful Asian, a down-trodden Negro or a poverty-stricken Nicaraguan?
3. In many countries, extreme wealth lives almost side by side with abject poverty. What can be done about this lack of concern?

c) PANEL DISCUSSION OR INTERVIEWS

Using people who have been working or studying the situations mentioned in the Reader sections -

- A Community Social Worker - or Policewoman,
- A Community Nurse or Doctor dealing with frustrated women,
- A Social Demographer or T.V. interviewer, who has been in Asia on special work,
- Missionary or Teacher or Expatriate Aussie from Papua - New Guinea,
- African Country, or Southern American Countries.

d) USE OF BOOKS, PAPER CUTTINGS, FILMS, SLIDES OR TAPES

Look into the issues involved arrange for several members to prepare for Discussion Introduction with articles from any of the suggested sources giving details currently relevant of the conditions.

Include here, also list of positions vacant on Mission field and as our daily papers also include ads 'vacant positions' these could lead to the 'our thoughts into how we can act positively.'

We suggest handout similar to those put out by World Christian Action Resource Material, in particular, 'The Challenge, and Not Enough' will help prepare people for action.
