All Saints' Church Dedication Festival.—Special services will be held on All Saints' Day, Tuesday, November 1st, in commemoration of the opening of the Church thirty-four years ago. There will be celebration of Holy Communion at 7.30, and Morning Service with a second celebration at 11 a.m.

THE ANNUAL CHORAL FESTIVAL will be held at 7.45 p.m., when the choirs of the Parish will be supplemented by neighbouring choirs. The choir spends much pains in preparation for this service, and it has been decided to secure accommodation for our regular church people through the plan adopted for this service last year, by the issue of tickets, which will be available until 7.30 p.m., after which no seats can be reserved. Early application should be made by letter to Wardens for such tickets. The offertory will be devoted to the Choir Fund.

Harbour Excursion.—For some years past the want of a "plant" for use at Tea-Meetings and the various social gatherings held in connexion with All Saints', and some ladies of the congregation have determined to take the matter up and endeavour to obtain the needed "plant." After consultation with the Choir and the Church Council it was arranged to hold a Harbour Excursion, the proceeds of which should be devoted to this object.

The excursion will be held during the next moonlight evenings, viz., on Wednesday, October 26th, the popular steamer "Lady Hampden" having been chartered for the occasion. A musical programme will be provided. Tickets, One Shilling each, may be obtained from the lady visitors and members of the committee, of which Mr. R. C. Wills is the Hon. Secretary. No pains will be spared to make the trip a pleasant and in every way a successful one.

All Saints' Mission Church Dedication Festival will be held on October 23rd, and preparations are being made to render the services worthy of the occasion. Well-known clergy will preach at the several services during the day. It is suggested that it would be a sign of thankfulness that a special effort be made through the offertory on that day to defray the cost of the recent external renovation of the church, and that members could commence now to lay by in store that the thank-offering to God may be a worthy one on that day, and so strengthen the Church for the work that lies before it.

The Anniversary Tea Meeting takes place on the Tuesday following, and a great re-union of parishioners and interested friends is anticipated. An attractive programme of music is being arranged.
