

Minutes of W.I.C.C. Executive meeting held at 139
Castlegagh St Sydney on Friday 19th Nov. 1991 at 1 P.M.

Opening devotions were led by the President with the scripture
reading taken from Isaiah 62:14.

Present were 13 members with
Apologies being received & accepted from Messrs Ralph & Jeanie.
Minutes of the last Executive meeting were read & confirmed.

Business Arising:

(1) Memorial Tribute to the late Mrs Violet Walker.

Mrs Holy read to the Executive the following tribute she
had prepared. "The Pilgrimage on earth has come to
an end of our beloved Mrs Walker. She was a foundation
member of the New South Wales Women's Inter Church Council
& was present at the inaugural meeting at St Stephen's Church
in 1938. Mrs Walker was a Life member until her death.
We were enriched in knowing her, because her motives
were high, her love deep & sincere, & her faith a
sustaining power. May the memory of Mrs Violet Walker
leave in us an ardent desire to follow in our Master's footsteps.

(2) Cost of printing for accompanying letter of thanks
with receipts. The Secretary was asked to contact a
printer re cost - & The Executive would look
into this matter.

(3) Representatives to National letter meeting in Feb 1972.

Messengers: Pfeiffer & Bill.

Observers: Messengers Marsden-Smedley, J Gibb with J Curtin as an alternate. It was agreed that these names be brought before Council on 26th Nov.

Mrs Curtin was requested to handle publicity for the National letter meeting in Feb 1972. It was also agreed that the Secretary, Asst Secretary co-operate in the compilation of the Annual State list report.

(4) The following recommendations to the National letter from N.S.W Women's Inter-Church Council re ~~future~~ Aboriginal Representation to future Asian Church Women's Conference were brought to the Executive from Mrs Wells.

(1) That it is desirable to include an Aboriginal Woman in the delegation from Australia to future meetings of the Asian Church Women's Conference

(2) That efforts to find such a person begin immediately, so that when names of delegates to the 1974 meeting are called for, the Working letter will be prepared & able to act accordingly.

(3) Relevant findings of discussion groups:

The President brought to the Executive a draft of this, requesting acceptance for distribution to Council, it was moved Deacons Andrew & recorded Mrs. Curtis that revised copies be made.

- (4) Venue of Nov Council meeting: to be the Assembly Hall in Elizabeth St, when a film on East Pakistan refugees be shown and a bread & cheese meal to be served after the meeting reminding us of the Christmas Bowl Appeal. It was ~~agreed~~ ^{suggested} that Council be advised that the meetings of Feb, March, April in 1972 would also be held in the Assembly Hall.

- (2) Letter from Mrs. Dingle with news of Bonnie Jan.
- (3) Letter from Violet Tompa, thanking us for the gift & card on the occasion of her 21st Birthday.

General Business:

- (1) The President informed the Executive that Brig. Ruth Smith + Mrs Brigadier Beveridge were now convalescing after surgery. Mrs Mills suggested that we have a family news segment to bring us in closer touch with absent members + that convenors be asked to report on their groups. *passed, recorded, carried.*
- (2) World Community Day Service 1971 - future action by Council members: It was decided that we include on revised form of study findings, information Council members should write about to State + Federal Ministers concerning Aboriginal problems.
- (3) nominations for convenors of 7th div of Least Love + representatives to National Council of Women + ~~Children's Film F.V.~~ As Mrs G. Walker has intimated the need to withdraw as representative to the National Council of Women. Mrs Stanhope (health permitting) is willing to accept nomination for convenorship of 7th div of the Least Love.
4. It was resolved that Council provide a filing cabinet for records of W.I.C.C. + A.C.W.

material. The State Council of A.C.C. to be approached for accommodation of filing cabinet.
