Dear Friends,

On the Sunday before Christmas, December 22nd, we will be having a Carol Service in All Saints'. It will begin at 7-00p.m.

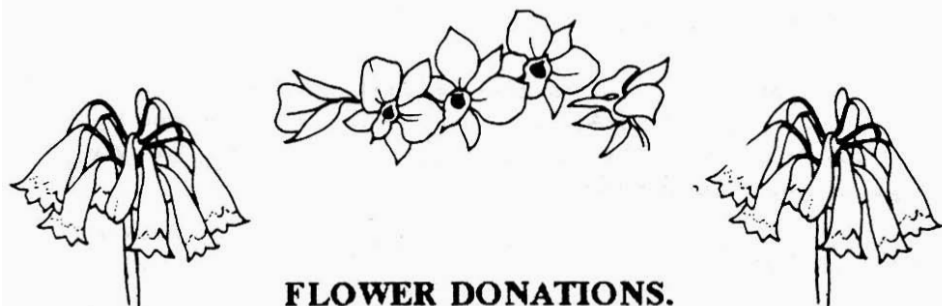
This is our opportunity to join together as a church family and sing carols and hear the wonderful Christmas message again.

CHRISTMAS, GOD WITH US

This devotional for Christmas Day has been taken from the Scripture Union 'DAILY BREAD' notes. These notes have a reading for everyday of the year. They are very helpful. Ask the Rector how you might obtain them for 1992.

ALMOST TOO GOOD TO BE TRUE

The biggest events of our lives often leave us lost for words. We're so overwhelmed by our emotions that our descriptions can fall short and sound flat.

READING - St. Luke 2: 1 - 20.

Maybe Luke writes so factually so that no one can accuse him of making up or exaggerating. See how carefully he records the names of those in government (1,2); how the birth came to be in Bethlehem (3-6); and finally the story of how the King of Glory spent his first night on earth asleep in a cattle-feeding trough (7).

What emotions these bald words cover! Imagine the journey over rough roads for Mary, about to give birth...the feeling of despair for Joseph as he can't find anywhere for them to stay.. the strange town at night, cold and dark...the sudden, blazing appearance of an army of angels...The facts give way to feelings: fear (9), joy (14), urgency (16), amazement (18), praise (20).

And there's room too for quieter feelings, as we, like Mary (19) ponder all these things and think deeply about what it means for God to come and be one with us.

A PRAYER.

Lord, I'm amazed as I think about how you stooped down to us and became a human baby. Help me to be joyful and thoughtful about all these things.
