THE RECTOR'S LETTER

All Saints' Rectory,

28th August, 1948.

Dear People of All Saints',

We were glad to have our old friend, Canon Tugwell, with us on the occasion of our Consecration Festival, and we thank him for his appropriate and helpful message. Canon Hirsby kindly took the service at St. Alban's, Lindfield, thus enabling me to be here for the Festival. We are most grateful to **ALL** who helped to make that day such a happy and successful one; particularly to the members of our Choir, whose uniformly good work throughout the day contributed so greatly to the devotional and inspirational character of the services. We thank those who kindly sent gifts of flowers, which Mrs. T. H. Bosward and Miss Elvy Olofsson arranged so artistically.

At this time last year we had reached the objective of our Special Appeal, but this year we are some £25 behind, the amount received to date being £174/3/-.

There are still 27 boxes outstanding, and no doubt there are some envelopes yet to be returned; so we hope we may, even yet, attain the goal of £200. The Churchwardens join me in thanking **all** who, by their generous responses, have brought us thus far towards our aim.

Thanks to the members of the Women's Guild and the hostesses who rallied round, and so willingly gave the additional help needed this year, and thanks to the assistance of so many who helped with gifts of various kinds, we were able to have another very successful Parish Festival Tea. Although, as you will see elsewhere, it was a financial success, we feel its value in maintaining the ideal of the Church as a family, and in providing opportunity for fellowship and reunion, was even greater. We were pleased to have with us Mr. J. R. Thorburn, of the Stanmore Presbyterian Church, as a representative of our neighbour Churches, particularly as this congregation will co-operate with his later on in the year. (In passing, we would mention November 23rd is the date of this combined effort, about which you will hear more next month.) After tea a musical recital, arranged by Mr. Eagar, was enjoyed in Church, and at the conclusion of Evensong an attractive programme (also arranged by our organist) was presented in the Parish Hall, and we thank **all** who contributed to it. At the conclusion of the programme the Treasurer expressed the Wardens' thanks to all who responded to the Special Appeal, and reported its progress, and the Rector added our appreciation of the efforts of **ALL** who made the Parish Tea possible, another successful Festival was then brought to a conclusion by the singing of the National Anthem.

We would again draw your attention to the War Memorial Fund. You will notice that we have passed our first hundred for the Stone of Remembrance, which is most encouraging. We feel that everyone would like to share in this Memorial, and as time is going rapidly by, we ask you to send in your gift or your promise as soon as you possibly can. The special form for your response was provided in the July "Chronicle," but if you have not retained your copy, just send your gift marked "Parish War Memorial."

I conclude as I began, with thanksgiving for our Forty-fifth Consecration Festival; but if these services are to have any lasting value, they must lead on to the consecration of ourselves to the tasks and opportunities of the present and the responsibilities of the future. There are forces abroad (probably much stronger in Australia than we realise), which are out to destroy the Church, and all that it stands for in the life of the community. It is our privilege as churchmen and churchwomen to let our lives be an influence for Christ and His Church. Where wrong assumptions are made we must try to correct them; where evil practices are accepted we must try to cleanse them; where injustice is allowed to flourish, we must seek to supplant it with justice, and we must seek to win from the powers of darkness those parts of human life where Christ's reign is challenged or ignored. A true Christian never supposes that a new world can be manufactured merely by altering the "set-up" of things. That is, indeed, an essential part of all true reform; but without new men there will be no

new world, and the greatest privilege of all is to try to win others to the Christian way. Christian fellowship is life together on Christ's terms: love, not suspicion; humility, not pride; generosity of judgment, not fault finding; readiness to serve, not letting other people do all the work—these are some of the marks of Christian fellowship.
