Mrs Rachel Cocks – ACW National Life Member – Tasmania

Passed away 16th August 1995.

Born in Hobart, Rachel trained as a nurse gaining certificates in general nursing, midwifery, child welfare and tuberculosis nursing. Following several years in bush nursing in Tasmania she went to Papua New Guinea with the London Missionary Society as Matron of Gemo Hospital. After 14 years in PNG she returned to Hobart's Royal Hobart Hospital as Assistant Matron. She was married to Rev Norman Cocks who passed away several years ago.

Filling positions of President and Secretary of the Tasmanian Unit, she attended national Conferences in 1972, 1974, 1975 and 1977. As delegate to ACWC Assembly in Bangkok in 1974 and the Tokyo Assembly in 1978, Rachel represented Australia for a continuous period of 8 years on ACWC. During that time she participated in the Silver Jubilee Celebration of the FLC in Manila during 1980.

As a very successful National President of ACW from 1979 – 81, Rachel chaired the first National conference to be held in Tasmania.

In 1987 Rachel was honoured in becoming Tasmania Unit 's National Life Member. As she was unable to attend Conference in Adelaide the award was presented to her later in Tasmania with Unit members and friends present. On receiving the badge she gave thanks to God for the award and expressed how much ACW had been part of her life which she had really enjoyed.

We praise and thank God for the selfless leadership of Rachel of the women of Tasmania and for her contribution to ACW and ACWC. She is remembered with gratitude, love and respect. It is certain that the Lord will be saying to her: "Well done good and faithful servant!"
