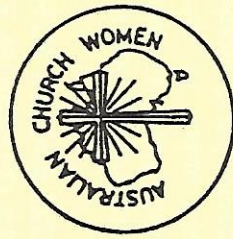

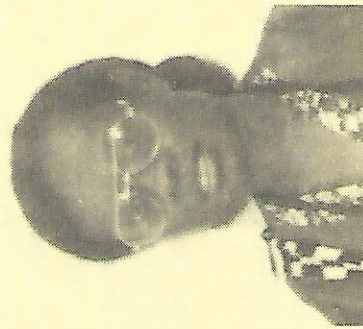

THE WINIFRED KIEK SCHOLARSHIP (WKS)

This Scholarship is available to Christian women from multi cultural Australia, Pacific Island Nations and member countries of Asian Church Women's Conference who already have basic training in a chosen field of work.

It provides the opportunity for further theological training to better equip the scholar to provide leadership in her own country, church and community. The scholarship covers fares, tuition fees and accommodation and is awarded annually.

When it is deemed more appropriate, the Scholarship Funds may be used for designated educational or charitable projects for women through the National Council of Churches of Australia World Christian Service.

FUNDS – FELLOWSHIP DAY

The offerings received at the Australian Church Women Fellowship Day Services, held throughout Australia in July each year, are invested and the interest used to finance the scholarship. 2001 SCHOLARSHIP Celestial Lusi

Celestial was born in Honiara in the Solomon Islands in 1967 and has been nominated by the Roroni Women's Fellowship, South Seas Ecumenical Church.

She has been brought up in a Christian family. Her father is a church elder, she has three brothers and two sisters and is the second to youngest in the family.

In 1990 and 1991, as President of her church women's group Celestial travelled around the island sharing the word of God and offering encouragement to women. From 1992-1995 she was Secretary, planning and organising conventions where many women from different places and denominations met together to talk about important issues for women. During 1996 and 1997 Celestial, working with one of the leaders, visited other islands and ran workshops and Bible studies.

In 1998 she commenced her Theology Diploma training at the Christian Leadership Training College in Papua New Guinea. At the end of 1999 she returned home to undertake her practical year working within the women's fellowship and children's ministry. Celestial has very much enjoyed her eight years involvement with these two ministries, particularly with the women from other denominations.

She has also been busy within her local church - training women, organising fellowship groups, Bible studies, Sunday School teaching and preaching, and she has attended Conferences on prayer in Samoa and Australia.

Celestial speaks and writes English, Solomon Island pidgin and of course her own regional dialect. Her special interests are music, singing, swimming and working in the garden.

This Scholarship Year will be her final year of study for her Diploma of Theology. She will then return home to continue her ministry within the women's fellowship, encouraged and supported by her nominating committee.

THE WKS TRUSTEES

The Trustees of the Scholarship, located in Adelaide, are responsible for investing funds and act as an advisory body to the National Executive of Australian Church Women.

WINIFRED KIEK FELLOWSHIP

At the discretion of the Trustees, in consultation with the National Executive, funds will be made available (on a pre-determined basis) to invite a representative from the following bodies: Asian Church Women's Conference; The Pacific Council of Churches; Past Winifred Kiek Scholars; The Fellowship of the Least Coin International Committee; Church Women United Aotearoa/NZ or a noted Christian woman leader to attend the National Conference of Australian Church Women and visit State/Territory Units. An outstanding Christian woman visiting Australia at any other time may be invited to visit State/Territory Units under such a Fellowship.

AUSTRALIAN CHURCH WOMEN BURSARY BOOK

You are invited to nominate a Christian woman whose association with the work of Australian Church Women is noteworthy.

Donations are invited and the interest earned from the invested monies is used to provide a book grant to current Scholarship holders.

A profile and photograph of the woman so honoured is then recorded in the Bursary Book, held by the National WKS Convenor.
