DAY OUT ON THE HAWKESBURY



About 90 people turned up for a really splendid day out on the Hawkesbury River which formed part of the 75th birthday celebrations of the Women's Auxiliaries of the Home Mission Society.

After fellowship and a picnic lunch at the Torrens ski-gardens, the party went in three separate groups for a cruise on the river.

Two groups went upstream and the other downstream - but all saw many of the historic landmarks which form part of the fascinating history of this river which novelist Anthony Trollope reckoned to be more beautiful than the Rhine.

Women's Auxiliary members, their families and friends, joined with HMS staff and their families to stroll along the riverside meadows or paddle cautiously in the water.

Some of the more adventurous children and dogs braved the water to swim and play.

People came from as far afield as Blackheath and Hazelbrook as well as nearer parts of Sydney.

All had a thoroughly enjoyable day.

And on the way home, more than 60 people crowded into the tiny, historic Anglican church at Wiseman's Ferry for a service of prayer, singing and an address by the second Chaplain to the Hawkesbury, the Rev. Alan Setchell, now a resident of the Anglican Retirement Villages at Rogan's Hill.
