Minutes Council Meeting Monday 16th March 2015 at 10.00 am at 222 Pitt Street Sydney

WELCOME: President Natalie McLeod welcomed all to the meeting

Natalie asked Helen Hill to introduce the new Presbyterian member to Council – June Kay.

DEVOTIONS: Natalie read from the Anglican Lenten Book *Power and Promise* by Peter Jensen. Reference was made to Noah and his times. We, as God's creation, have great power and understanding yet lack the righteousness required to live in this world. As it was in the time of Noah, it is now. Noah heard the word of the lord and obeyed. In our times there is resistance to the truth. According to human enterprise, Noah's project was a foolish enterprise. The hearts of men were hardened; not one extra passenger boarded the ark and only one family was saved.

MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING of Monday 16th February were moved and adopted by Helen Hill and Carmel Keys.

BUSINESS ARISING:

1. National Executive National President - Major Lyn Middleton reported [A] Registration Forms for Conference are due by end of March to Jennifer Peffer [B] Open Day registration needs to be sent. Open Day is instead of Spiritual Enrichment Day for the New South Wales State Unit Inc. [C] The booklet of essays from the Essay Writing competition instigated by the Forward Group was promoted. Cost \$5. The essay competition is now to be advertised in a school in each state. Carmel Keys is to approach St Scholastica's regarding the possibility of participating in the essay competition. [D] Council members were urged to continue to pray for NE.

2. Archival Materials: Isabel is gathering profiles of National Past Presidents [ACW] for the National Conference 2015. Word was received that Shirley Brooks [Tas] passed away. Isabel is proposing a display of Conference photos and requested help in naming those in the photos.

3. President Elect: President Natalie announced that Commissioner Jan Condon had written saying that the next president from The Salvation Army would be Pamela Freeman. Approved.

Treasurer: Helen Richardson stated that bank interest on investments has lowered. Balance of \$5849.81. Donation to Uniting Church for use of rooms to be raised to \$350 per annum. Payments for the Fellowship Day Order of service. Helen moved that the report be received and the accounts be paid. Seconded Tricia Graham. Passed unanimously.

Fellowship of the Least Coin [FLC]: Major Lillian Hodges reminded those present about the visit to Mums' cottage on Monday 23rd March. A snippet was read from the Messages and Reports from FLC in 2014, telling of the sacrifice of time and the effort made by a young mother in Guatemala to attend the training for pastoral care provided by a grant from ICFLC. Lillian read a devotional piece from Mary Mikhael in Lebanon. This was about Lydia, the first European believer in Europe; a business woman who became a light for the whole history of Europe. Lillian prayed that all may use their homes as lights for the community where we live.

Special Days: Lyn Middleton pointed out the contents of the parcels that had been prepared for Fellowship day 2015. The theme is *Building in Line with God's Design*. Scripture readings are: Luke 12: 13-21 & 1 Peter 4: 8-11. This service has been written by the Tasmanian Unit. Front cover by Juanita Miller. The parcels are available for those present to take.
