Report to NSW Unit Council Meeting 17 November 2003 of  
Australian Church Women National Conference  
Perth 6-10 October 2003

The venue, Swanleigh, is located in a rural setting on the upper reaches of the Swan River. The spacious grounds made it easy to walk for exercise, and many availed themselves of the opportunity, especially early in the morning. Accommodation enabled most of the eighteen from New South Wales to be housed as a unit, and for five days we coped comfortably with our curtains, cupboards, and close living. Co-operation was compulsory - and we had lots of laughs. Our communal lounge was invaluable as a place where we could for short periods of time discuss seriously, joke, socialise over tea, coffee and slice, catch up briefly on world news, or give support to one another in word or prayer.

Meal times gave the opportunity to mix with interstate people, as well as to share in the really appetising meals prepared for us.

Devotions led by State Units and National Executive provided inspiration morning and evening.

Not all plans worked, but emergencies were dealt with effectively. The Reverend Eira Clapton who was to lead Bible studies was unable to attend the first day due to illness, and Lee Edwards and Nancy McLaren set questions relating to the theme of 'Community'. In reporting her group's findings to the plenary session, Brenda Dickinson said that the NSW theme song "We being many are one in the Lord" summed one question up, and we sang for the benefit of all, capably led by Brenda. It was a special moment.

The first Bible study presented by Eira considered how community as God's household of life is where all contribute by giving and receiving. We were reminded that God loves everyone, and we are expected to do the same as we share love in community.

Our next focus was on community with the earth. To lessen consumption of resources and improve sustainability it was suggested we live every day as though we will live for ever.

Most of the suggestions were not new to us, but were timely reminders that as Christians we should take seriously our role in the wider community, offering, for example, hospitality to the stranger, and being an example in sustainable lifestyle.

To set the scene for our sharing in and as community, the National Executive used the idea of an 'Agape' or fellowship meal. This is an ancient tradition of the Church followed by the Iona Community in Scotland whose service was adapted for our use.

To organise conference participants beyond State groupings, interest groups were formed around photography, computers, travel, family history, books and reading, grandparenting, music, puzzles, handicrafts and interest in organisations. A facilitator from Western Australia was assigned to each group.

Business was conducted using consensus voting, a method which seeks to arrive at agreement while ensuring that people who differ from the majority feel that their voice has been heard. An illustration which might help us to appreciate this method was where a few people indicated they were not happy with the decision being taken. When they explained their view further it became the preferred option and was agreed on by everyone. The business sessions were conducted in a good atmosphere, but would it be better if visitors had other options rather than sitting through business where they can make no contribution?

Special guests at the conference were Wong Wai-Yin Christina, from Hong Kong who attended on a Winifred Kiek Fellowship, and Monique Crabtree from Western Australia, one of the Winifred Kiek Scholarship holders for 2003. Both these women spoke, Christina giving insights into the difficulties faced by church women in Hong Kong and some of the measures being taken to equip them for a more positive role. Monique told of her background, her studies and her trust for the future.

A number of resolutions were directed at clarifying and/or correcting the Constitution and Guidelines. For example, 'Honouring Australian Church Women' as the title should ensure that the Bursary Book is freed from the problem of whether women can be recognised in their lifetime.

The wider range of business resulted in conference agreeing that letters should be sent to governments regarding National Housing Policy; Asylum Seekers in Detention; Gender-inclusive Language in the Australian Constitution; Treatment of Women Victims of Trafficking; and the Plight of Young Carers - young children who are the primary carers for adults suffering from diseases such as Huntington. National Executive will make initial contact, but it is expected that State and Territory Units will be involved in follow up work.

Our great day of 'liberation' was a welcome break in the city of Perth. The Governor of Western Australia hosted conference members at Government House, though unfortunately his wife was ill. We enjoyed tea on the terrace overlooking the lovely gardens, as well as viewing the public rooms which featured fine furniture, portraits and photographs. Floral arrangements were eye-catching and beautiful.





# Asian Church Women's Conference

## The Statement of 13th Quadrennial Assembly of Asian Church Women's Conference

Sixty five delegates and one hundred and twenty-one observers from thirty countries, twenty guests and twenty one local visitors gathered in celebration for the 13th Quadrennial Assembly of Asian Church Women's Conference and 50th Anniversary of ACWC and FLC in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, 08-13 October 2006.

### We acknowledge:

- the inspiration and guidance we have received from God from the inception of ACWC and FLC.
- the selfless service and commitment of the founders of ACWC and FLC, especially Shanti Solomon who had the vision and courage to start fellowships and movements fifty years ago and the foremothers who led them.

### We affirm:

- that women are created in the image of God and not less than men in any way.
- that women have been blessed with the strength and power of creation and transformation for reconciliation, peace and justice.
- that ACWC and FLC continue to act as a

platform for women, praying, supporting, encouraging and empowering each other.

- support and welcome the positive input and vitality of young women to lead us on through the next fifty years.
- all initiatives and moves to improve and value the leadership role of women in society and family; particularly in the worship and decision making of our churches.

### We condemn:

- the degradation of women in any way particularly all types of violence, trafficking, physical mutilation, prostitution or any form of commodification.
- with horror the rapid spread of HIV/AIDS with its stigma especially from within the family and lack of access to medical treatment.
- conflicts in the name of religion, ethnicity, caste, race or gender.

### We recommend to ACWC:


- to organize opportunities for interfaith dialogue among women for their mutual support.

- the setting up of a Young Women's Committee within ACWC.
- to take an advocacy role and support women as they strive for gender justice.

### We call upon member organizations from different countries to:

- re-read the Bible with women's perspective to seek Christ's liberating power against any exclusion.
- support education, awareness and mobilization of resources for disaster preparedness.
- initiate and support continuing education for protection of women and their families against violence in any form including HIV/AIDS.
- address poverty and seek alternative ways towards a just economy for women.

Being Christian women of Asia, we have the privilege and responsibility to fulfill the will of God in our part of the world. Let us commit ourselves to celebrate the legacy, live the Jubilee and vision the future with hope and trust in our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

## ORIGIN

The National Council of Churches in Australia (NCCA) Gender Commission was formed in 2001 as a result of a decision of the Forum of the National Council of Churches in Australia.

The Gender Commission grew out of the previous NCCA Network on Women and Gender Relationships which had been established in 1996.

This Commission was established in recognition of the ongoing struggle of women and supportive men within the various church traditions and structures to develop inclusive models of community, education and ministry.

The Commission has developed out of the awareness that the role and place of women in society and Church is often limited by oppressive structures.



## PURPOSE

The Gender Commission will work to develop and promote effective inclusive models of Christian life within and between member churches, NCCA, Commissions and Networks and other agencies as appropriate.



## ROLE

- To be a resource for the:
  - ◆ Executive
  - ◆ National Forum
  - ◆ Heads of Churches
 on matters pertaining to women and to relationship between women and men within churches.
- To develop, promote and engender ecumenical discussion on inclusivity in NCCA member churches.
- To contribute the perspective of women to official NCCA policy and to:
  - ◆ the internal life of the Churches
  - ◆ all NCCA Commissions
  - ◆ the networks
  - ◆ agencies
  - ◆ member churches
- To encourage:
  - ◆ exploration of inclusivity in ministry in all NCCA member churches
  - ◆ women to access theological education

- To consult with the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Ecumenical Commission on gender issues.
- To foster inter-faith discussion with women on gender issues.
- To facilitate wider ecumenical relationships by:
  - ◆ maintaining communication with the Women's Unit of the WCC.
  - ◆ building and maintaining effective relationships with Christian Conference of Asia and the Pacific Council of Churches.




## RATIONALE
