Minutes of the Council Meeting held at 222 Pitt Street, Sydney on
20 March 1995

Prior to opening the meeting, President Lucelle King extended congratulations and birthday greetings to Deaconess Mary Andrews as she celebrated her 80th birthday. The Deaconess responded with thanks for the special cake and flowers with which she had been presented and, quoting Col. 1:11-12, gave thanks to God for His goodness, with a prayer that He would give us His wonderful strength until we share in His glory.

OPENING: Lucelle welcomed members and led devotions which centred on the Authority of Jesus - Matt. 28:18,19; God gave Him the authority to rule and govern and control; this was predicted long before He arrived - Is. 9:6,7. By obeying Jesus, we acknowledge the power and authority that God has given Him.

PRESENT AND APOLOGIES: There were 48 in attendance and 15 apologies. A welcome was extended to visitors, and apologies from Joan Tong and Marie McCann were noted. Edith Ridge was thanked for acting as Secretary for this meeting. Prayers were requested for the six-month-old grandson of Helen Richardson. Baby Thomas is critically ill in the Children's Hospital.

MINUTES OF FEBRUARY MEETING were confirmed as a correct record.

GUIDELINES FOR PRESENTATION OF SPECIAL DAY SERVICES:

Lucelle King spoke about the importance of PREPARATION for ACW Special Day Services, Edith Ridge told of the need to attend to detail in the PRESENTATION of the Service, Marie Majoor spoke concerning the importance of FOLLOW UP after the Service. A printed summary of the suggestions was issued to members after discussion had taken place. The importance of a planning meeting, prior to each Special Day, was stressed as was the need for explanation to the congregation of the two offerings at the World Community Day Service, so that people understood the difference between the FLC giving and the general offering.

BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES: 1. Special Functions 1995: Ecumenical Luncheon 17 July. It was noted that Sr Lyn Green will speak on Ecumenism. Charge will be \$10 and the Executive have luncheon arrangements in hand. The function, to be held at the Scots Church, should finish by 2 pm. Noted that an application has been received for grant from Girls Brigade - 'Christian Women in Leadership' - seeking \$5,000 to help young women realise their own potential and self-worth and to extend personal leadership qualities.

PROMOTION: Noted that the Fellowship Day Service master copy has arrived and that Packing Day will be 22 May at 10 am in Room 5A.

PUBLICITY: H McIver requests any written coverage and photos of World Day of Prayer and other branch activities whenever available.

NEWSLETTE: Deadline for next issue will be 10 April (Executive meeting).

GENERAL BUSINESS: Nomination Forms now available for AGM on 24 April.

On hearing of the need of the women of Mabale for a sewing machine, Margaret offered her own hand machine and Rotary arranged for its delivery. In January, Margaret was able to join a tour of Zimbabwe and saw for herself the wonderful results that 'Margaret Jessup Sewing Club' had achieved with her little machine. Margaret gave a moving account of her experiences attending Services in Bulawayo and while on safari in Nairobi and when the school children sang to her a blessing. When called upon to speak at one of the Services, Margaret had been able to pass on greetings from ACW. Margaret thanked members for prayers for her well-being and travelling mercies.
