Mission Church Building Debt.—The Wardens desire thankfully to thankfully acknowledge the receipt of £5 from Mr. M. Albery, and £5 from Mr. P. Hordern.

The Rev. J. F. Russell has been appointed Rector of the important parish of Katoomba. We all congratulate Mr. Russell on his well-earned and richly deserved promotion, and wish him and Mrs. Russell every happiness in their new sphere of life and work.

It is nearly three years since Mr. Russell came amongst us and during that time his labours have been marked by all the energy, zeal and ability which we expected from the reputation which he brought from his previous work in the parish of Camden. It would be difficult at any time to find a successor who could carry on, as Mr. Russell has done, the many works in which he has been engaged in the parish, for he has been a successful teacher, a diligent and acceptable visitor, a friend and counsellor of the young, and a loyal and conscientious colleague in the ministrations of the Church and the administration of parochial affairs. At the present time, however, it is well nigh impossible to find at all a suitable successor, for there is a lamentable dearth of young men entering the ministry, and several parishes in and around Sydney are in need of assistant curates.

The prayers of all who are deeply interested in the welfare of this parish are asked that the Divine Head of the Church may send to us one who shall be filled with zeal for His service and an earnest desire to further the highest good of His people in this place.

The Parochial Pleasant Evening.—This annual social gathering of parishioners was in every way a decided success. The interest taken in the preliminary arrangements and the amount contributed for tables and expenses was greater than ever before. The social tea and the entertainment were both pronounced excellent, and a most cordial vote of thanks was expressed to Mrs. Goddard and the ladies who made the preparations, to Mr. Wills, the Hon. Secretary and Treasurer, and to all who contributed in any way to the gratifying result. The proceeds were larger than on any former occasion, amounting to £31 14s. 4d., which sum was voted by the Committee of ladies and gentlemen to the Church Debt Extinction Fund.
