Annual Report for the Year ending April 30th, 1958

During the past year the N.S.W. Women's Inter-Church Council has held eight ordinary and one special meeting, as well as the Annual Rally and the Annual Community Day. Work for Wyalena Hostel has been continued, and the sense of fellowship between our members has been strengthened.

The Annual Rally was held in Wesley Chapel when Mrs. C. W. Stolz was inducted as the President and presented with the Official Bible by the retiring President, Mrs. Lt.-Colonel Garlick. The address was delivered by Mrs. J. Hunter who took as her subject "Modern Miracles".

Annual Community Day was held at the Friends' Meeting House on September 27th. The subject for the day was "Who is my Neighbour?" Speakers in the morning were Mrs. Brigadier Smartt and Miss M. J. Steel, who outlined the teaching of Jesus and of St. Paul on this question. In the afternoon Mrs. N. Cocks spoke of her recent travels, and especially of the racial problems in South Africa. All who were present felt that it was an inspiring and helpful occasion.

At our ordinary meetings we have been privileged to hear the following guest speakers.

Major Coleman on her recent trip to England to attend a conference to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the founding of the Home League.

The other ordinary meetings were

devoted to reports from the delegates who have represented the Council on various affiliated bodies. We have also been represented at women's meetings in a number of churches. We are grateful to the speakers who have come to us, and to those of our members who have represented the Council on affiliated societies.

In July a basket lunch was arranged to enable members to meet Mrs. Nonomyia, a prominent Japanese worker for the W.C.T.U., who gave an interesting account of the position of the Christian Church in Japan today.

In December, 1957, the Council issued a statement protesting against the undue emphasis on sex and violence in the Press. The statement was published in the Sydney Morning Herald and received a number of favourable comments.

We are very grateful to the British and Foreign Bible Society who have permitted us to hold our ordinary meetings in the Board Room at Bible House. Having such a pleasant and convenient meeting place has helped greatly in the smooth conduct of our meetings. We are also grateful to the trustees of Wesley Chapel for allowing us to hold our Rally there, and to all the others who in different ways have helped in our work.

Our thanks are due to the members of the Appeal and of the Hostel Committee who have given so much time to the care of the Hostel, and above all to our retiring President, Mrs. Stolz, to whose wise guidance so much of the success of the year's work is due.

In presenting this report we are grateful to our Heavenly Father for His leading during the past year.

In July, 1957, Mrs. McCallum resigned as Matron of "Wybalena" on account of ill health. Miss Grace Doughty became Matron, and with the help of Mrs. Lock, as Assistant Matron, is doing very well. Both these ladies are loved

An overdraft of £100 was sought for, and agreed to by the Bank. To date this has not been used, but is available if necessary.

An attempt was made by our Hon. Solicitor to get exemption from Municipal rates, but this was refused by the Council.

The property was painted at the very low cost of £120, by Major Knudsen; the price being for little more than the cost of material. Five upstairs bedrooms were carpeted, and a vacuum cleaner purchased.

A piano has been bought and will eventually become the gift of the Western Suburbs Auxiliary—the Auxiliary has already paid £40 towards its cost.

A committee was elected to take care

of applications for residence at "Wybalena", viz., Mesdames Lewis, Millar and Knight. All the girls appear to be happy and contented, and the staff and casual help work amicably together looking after the physical and spiritual welfare of the residents.

Our grateful thanks are due to Mrs. Brig. Lewis for her gracious leading, to Miss Roseby, who, although not able to attend all meetings, does a worthy work as treasurer, and all the members of the committee. We offer our grateful thanks to the Appeals Committee for making money available to enable us to meet our commitments.
