February 1993.

My Dear Friends,

What next? It's easy to say "Happy New Year," but what will 1993 bring - pain, pleasure, perhaps both? Uncertain, isn't it?

Instead of being fearful, the Christian should follow the example of David, who many years ago, put himself and his whole future in the sovereign care of God.

"*My times*" he said, "*are in your hands*". (Psalm 31:15) This was not fatalism, (a glance at the Psalm proves this). It was that in all his trials, David had complete confidence in God's control of every circumstance.

Human nature is reluctant to acknowledge the absolute sovereignty of God; we think we can manage our own affairs.

But God is in control, and He alone can stand to know the future of sinners, like us, in a sinful world.

God calls us to commit our days and years into His hands, for each of us is a creature of time, destined for Eternity.

We need to go to His cross and take it to our heart as the only hope of salvation.

The real question about the future, is the one that concerns your own personal commitment to Him.

The only uncertainty is whether you have really put your times in His hand.

And the one thing to fear is that you might not give the right answer to that question.
