The Story Behind the Hymn

The Day Thou Gavest Lord, Is Ended



THE WORLD VIEW of this hymn arises from the fact that it was originally a missionary hymn, written for *A Liturgy for Missionary Meetings* in 1870.

This movement of the church outward to the south and east was something relatively new for Anglicans. William Carey, first missionary to India from England (1793), could not get the backing of the established Church. The Anglican *Church Missionary Society* was not created until 1799. But now in the 1870s England was fully embarked upon her ideal of empire. she had outposts all over the world. the East India Company had gradually been taken over by the state until after the Indian Mutiny it had been wholly absorbed (1858). Only six years after this hymn was written, Victoria was to be proclaimed "Empress of India" (1876). It was fitting, therefore, and inevitable that the Church should cultivate a world-outlook and assume world-responsibility. This hymn is an expression of that concern and of the joy of hearing in imagination the ceaseless sound of prayer and praise breaking beneath the dawns and sunsets as they daily encircle that earth. The hymn is a series of pictures. The expanding British Empire thus becomes a symbol of the growing Kingdom of God that shall outlive all human institutions

It is no wonder that Queen Victoria chose this hymn to be sung at the Diamond Jubilee Service in 1897, and sung it was on the same day by tens of thousands of churches throughout the world.
