

ENCOUNTER

E N C O U N T E R

This PREAMBLE is meant to be read quietly by the worshippers while they await the beginning of the Service.

"A tree is born, a tress dies, the forest lives for ever". (This was a message from a political detainee in an infamous Asian Detention Camp).

"A grain of wheat remains a solitary grain unless it falls into the ground and dies; but if it dies, it bears a rich harvest." (John 12. 24.N.E.B.)

"To be a witness is to live your life in such a way that it would not make sense if God did not exist." (From an Asian witness).

Recently, thirty women gathered together in a storm-battered Retreat House on the fringe of an Asian city. A typhoon had just preceded the gathering, its skirts still lashing, tearing, devastating, drowning and destroying. The gathering consisted of women from some of the participating nations of the Asian Church Women's Conference. Women came from Malaysia Singapore, Indonesia, the Philippines, Australia and New Zealand. From India, officers of the Conference; from Japan, the solitary male, one of the two resource persons present. Thus, in an unlit, powerless, waterless, unsewered, chilly building, began ENCOUNTER.

For the Australians and New Zealanders, it was indeed an encounter with REALITY. They only of the group were those whose Christian commitment demanded little of them.

It was an encounter with people who dared, who risked, who loved. Each one, with the exception of five white faces, came from countries where the only right they possessed was the right to agree; where to be a Christian was to be prepared to stand up and be counted for Christ's sake, involving risk and the ever-present fear of arrest and detention as a subversive. It was an encounter with CONTRAST.

An encounter with nature's glorious beauty and with her vengeance and its aftermath; with luxuriant opulence, where those who have, gain more and more; with unimaginable poverty and want, where those who have little, lose even what they have. It was an encounter with SUPPRESSION, where freedom of speech, so contemptuously handled by Australians, is denied; where a decision to speak can mean loss of liberty, of loved ones, of life, too often preceded by interrogation and torture.

It was an encounter with incredible COURAGE
boundless HOPE and daring FAITH.

*An encounter at every turn with the
Crucified God!
An encounter with those who had
encountered HIM!*

FIRST THOUGHTS.

LEADER : Together we meet.....
What does it mean to meet?
People meet by chance or on purpose;
with joy, with fear, with hope.
Though they meet, they may be so far
apart, neutral or hostile, that they
do not meet at all. Then there is
cause for sorrow. Sometimes, when
they meet, they discover each other,
so that the eyes are opened and the
hearts touched, and they bring dignity
and grace to each other.
What do we look for in our meeting?

Pause

ALL : *Oh God, we begin to see how often we
have refused to meet people, refused
to trust ourselves to them. We have
been insensitive and thoughtless. We
have been proud or afraid. We ask you
through them to forgive us.*

LEADER : Together we meet before God.....
As people of faith, we recognise
another dimension to our meeting. When
we gather in the name of God, He is
among us in His holiness and power.
How shall we understand this meeting?

Pause

ALL : *Open our eyes, O God, to your
glory, that we may worship in spirit
and in truth, and offer you the
praise of glad and thankful hearts.*

LEADER : Together we meet before God to hear
His voice.....
As Moses and the children of Israel
came to the tent of meeting before
the Lord, and knew His promise that
He would speak with them and sanctify
the meeting with His glory, so we
stand in His presence and await His
word. What will be the word of the
Lord? Shall we hear it or shall we
refuse to hear it?

Pause

ALL : *We begin to see how we have refused
to meet you, O Lord. We have been
afraid to let your word enter our
hearts. We have been afraid that
you would ask of us more than we
wanted to give. Lord, we are sorry.
We ask you to forgive us.*

Pause

LEADER : We ask that in this meeting God will
help us to hear and to understand,
to see and to perceive.

Pause

ALL : Meet and speak with us, O God,
and teach us to desire what you
desire for us and for all whom we
meet. Give us wisdom and courage,
and let us not be weary in doing
your will, through Jesus Christ,
your Son, our Lord.

THE GREETING OF PEACE.

LEADER : As a token of our resolve to go out
of ourselves to meet with those
around us, we offer our hand in
fellowship and exchange a greeting
of peace, saying, "Peace to you".

THE READINGS.

LEADER : We open our minds to hear the
Word of the Lord.

Indonesia's Transmigration Programme

It helps to give pre-departure training in Agricultural skills to trans-migrants, to enable them to meet the challenge of their new environment.

During 1975, with funds available through the World Council of Churches, 165 families (540 persons) were transmigrated.

The Churches' participation in transmigration has stimulated the government to place emphasis on the importance of pre-departure preparation and training, and could be considered as an attempt to take part in the Government's effort to achieve an even distribution of population to all islands in Indonesia.

Experience with these programs, which were started in 1972, has shown that people in poor areas are willing and interested in transmigration. After living for 3 to 5 years in the new areas, the transmigrants enjoy a higher standard of living than previously in Java.

Of the homeless and jobless who had moved to Jakarta from Central and East Java, in search of a better life, the Municipal government decided to transmigrate 70 families. Prior to departure, these families were given a 2½ month training in basic agriculture, animal husbandry, carpentry, and basic skills. 20 families were settled in Bengkulu (South Sumatera) and 50 in Kendari (South East Sulawesi).

Plans are being made to carry out follow-up care after the families have settled in the new areas.

The World Council of Churches involvement in this project is giving new hope for the future to these people.

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
