Dear Friends,

Adolescence is a difficult time for all of us. We think we are grown up, our parents think we are children, whilst others just stand and look on smiling and shaking their heads.

Our country thinks two hundred years has brought us to "the age of discretion" (a good Prayer Book expression); but older cultures may still see us as a young, very young society. In reality we are only teenagers - adolescents. A nation not yet mature. A nation not yet sure where we are going.

I don't think we should regret our immaturity, nor should we seek to accelerate the process of growing old and wise. Both of these attitudes could well lead us down the wrong path, a path which may lead to much hurt and sorrow.

We are who we are. We are what we are. To pretend otherwise is to deceive ourselves rather than others.

Our song "Advance Australia Fair" could be better named "Advance Australia Where?"

Shall we become a fun loving people who won't work, leaving work to either the latest migrant or a contract worker from another land? Shall we shut our eyes to the needs of the nations so close that they are nearer to us than Perth is to Adelaide, or to Canberra? What of the ethnic, religious, coloured, economics, aged or uneducated minorities in our country, do they get a fair share of our wealth; or do some receive privileges but not take up the responsibility of their Australian citizenship? Are we just a selfish, intolerant, greedy,

perhaps lazy country? Worst still have we just lost our conscience?

These are all questions that need to be thought about especially in this Bi-centenary year.

We can if we wish hold great discussions; make impassioned speeches; accuse each other; or, start a new political party, if we are really into that. I doubt the effectiveness of all these things because our country really finds its direction from the individuals who make up its population.

If as individuals we are selfish, or lazy, or intolerant, or just plain thoughtless, then collectively that will be the character of Australia. Nothing in the world can change it.

What will be our character as a nation? In what direction shall we go? That depends on us!

The writer of the Book of Proverbs gives some good advice to us as individuals and collectively as a nation.

"TRUST IN THE LORD WITH ALL THY HEART
AND LEAN NOT UNTO THINE OWN UNDERSTANDING
IN ALL THY WAYS ACKNOWLEDGE HIM
AND HE SHALL DIRECT THY PATH"

Sound advice to a person seeking a direction in life, and equally sound advice to a nation of people wondering what will be their role in the world.

God has a plan for our well being. Let us seek it and follow it.
