



### RECTOR'S LETTER

My Dear Friends,

The Parish Mission, conducted by the Rev. G. J. Coad and his Church Army team was a great success. It is thirty years since there was a Mission in the Parish when Captain Cowland was the Missioner. The attendance at the early Communion Services and the evening meetings was good, and made us feel they were more than worthwhile. Captain Coad gave very helpful and challenging messages that will be long remembered. I want to thank all who helped make the Mission such a success; those who attended; those who opened their homes for Cottage Meetings; those who provided members of the team with meals, and those who helped with gifts of food or money. All Saints' Parish will long be remembered by the Mission Team for their friendliness and hospitality and co-operation. You will be pleased to know that something like £65 was given in retiring offertories to the work of the Church Army during the week.

Sunday, 1st November, will be All Saints' Day. The Confirmation service will be held at 11 a.m. that day instead of Wednesday evening as previously announced, because a special commemoration of Bishop Hilliard's Consecration as a Bishop will be held in the Chapter House, St. Andrews Cathedral, that night. Again, may I remind you that we are to present Bishop Hilliard with his Th.D. gown as a token of our appreciation and on his retirement as Co-adjutor Bishop of Sydney. We particularly ask any who were confirmed by him to contribute to the gift. [The Bishop is an ex-All Saints' boy and was confirmed in our Church.

On Sunday, November 8th, the special preacher at 7.15 p.m. will be Major-General the Rev. C. A. Osborne, Chaplain to the Archbishop.

Please remember the Annual Fete on 21st November, 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. We hope to wipe out the remaining debt on our Parish Hall which was built in 1926. Your co-operation is urgently needed.


