THE RECTOR'S LETTER.

All Saints' Rectory,
26th July, 1943.

Dear People of All Saints',

Forty years ago, on August 15, 1903, our Parish Church was consecrated. We commemorate that fact with services of praise and thanksgiving on August 15, 1943. In order that we may make the commemoration worthy of our Church and parish, we ask the co-operation and support of ALL our people in the services which are being arranged for that day, and in the social side of the commemoration at the Festival Tea on Wednesday, August 18.

On this occasion we endeavour, so far as we can, to get in touch with former parishioners, to invite them to worship with us in their old parish church on the day of the Consecration Festival. There will be no special invitation card issued this year, but this paper contains an invitation on page 5 which you might send to old friends. In these days of petrol restrictions it will no doubt be more difficult for former parishioners now living at a distance to get here. Perhaps some of our present parishioners could offer hospitality to those who come from far, and thus help to solve some of the difficulty. At any rate, do, please, invite as many former parishioners as you can. It won't matter in the least if they receive more than one invitation; it will show them we are really keen on having them with us on August 15! Next, you can help by getting in touch with present parishioners who do not come regularly and those who do not come at all, and invite them to attend. Also, please remember the Festival Services in your daily prayers.

This year we are sorry to say there will be no Men's Breakfast. The Women's Guild, upon whom falls the responsibility of catering, has reluctantly decided that owing to the difficulties caused by rationing, it had better devote all its energies towards the Parish Festival Tea. We feel, however, that the men will understand the difficulty, and we hope that they will still come to the early celebration as they have done hitherto.


Those who have collecting boxes which were issued some months ago will please return them on the Festival Sunday—August 15th. For those who have no box, there is a special envelope issued with this "Chronicle." Last year our boxes and envelopes brought in over £162: this year we hope we may exceed that amount—in fact, with a little additional effort, I see no reason why we should not reach £200 for our Parish Hall Fund. This can be done if we all give, not what we won't miss, but all we can spare.

The Festival Tea and Social Reunion will be held on Wednesday, August 18. Tickets for the Tea and Reunion are now on sale, and may be obtained from your District Visitor, from members of the Women's Guild or from the Rectory at a cost of one shilling and sixpence, which increase is justifiable in view of present day costs. You can assist us in approximating the number for whom it will be necessary to provide, by purchasing your ticket so soon as possible. We shall be glad to hear from parishioners who may be willing to donate a table or portion thereof, and promises of gifts in kind will be very welcome.

As already advised, Confirmation Classes will commence very shortly. The weekly classes will be held at the Rectory and will be for women and girls on Tuesday, August 3rd, and for men and boys on Thursday, August 5th, at 7.30 p.m. Candidates should be fourteen years of age on or before October 24th: but if there are young people who are nearly 14 and who wish to be prepared for Confirmation, application can be made to the Archbishop for special permission to admit them to the preparation classes. The Confirmation Service will be on Sunday morning, October 24, and has been so arranged that the confirmees may make their first

Communion on our Patronal Festival Sunday—October 31. It is most important that candidates shall put these preparation classes before all other engagements, and attend them with the utmost regularity.

MATTERS MAINLY PAROCHIAL.

The First Consecration Service.—In view of the approaching Consecration Festival, a few historical facts will be of interest.

The Consecration of All Saints' took place on Saturday, 15th August, 1903. The ceremony was performed (in the absence of the Archbishop of Sydney, who was on a visit to England) by the Rt. Revd. G. H. Stanton, Bishop of Newcastle, in the presence of a large congregation which included 22 clergy. According to the "Sydney Morning Herald" (17/8/'03) the Bishop made reference to the "wise provision made by the Church of England that no church should be consecrated until it was free from debt; the gift to God must be unfettered." At the same time the window in memory of Hon. Septimus Stephen was unveiled, and the altar railings and other accessories to worship dedicated.

"The Daily Telegraph" (17/8/'03) gave a brief sketch of parochial history. Originally part of St. Peters, it became part of the parish of Canterbury in 1844, and apparently had its own incumbent from 1860. On Sunday, April 15, 1860, the first service was held in a tiny schoolroom which had been built three years previously, the officiating minister being the Revd. P. J. Smith, incumbent of the newly-formed parish of Canterbury. On 17th December, 1870, the foundation stone of the present church was laid, and being partly built it was opened on November 1st, 1871. In 1880 the plan was completed (with the exception of the "tower and steeple"). In the area originally served by the Church there are now seven parishes, namely Summer Hill (part), Marrickville, Leichhardt, Enmore (part), Annandale, Dulwich Hill and Stanmore.

As the parishioners of over forty years ago worked and sacrificed to make the Consecration of their Parish Church possible; so we, in different times and in different circumstances, but with a like loyalty to the same Church and all for which it stands in a distracted world, are challenged by their example to face the responsibilities of our day, and to hand on the torch, still burning brightly, to those who shall come after.—C.E.A.

District Visitors.—At the last meeting of the Association a motion of sympathy was passed, and later conveyed to the family of the late Mrs. Donaldson, who was a loyal District Visitor for many years. Mrs. Hacking kindly came to our assistance when Mrs. Jagoe left for Goulburn, and is already doing good work in that district. Mrs. Brennan volunteered to take over Mrs. Donaldson's District, and has commenced work there, in addition to doing Miss Ockwell's District last month, when the latter was unwell. Mrs. Handel, in her usual willing manner, has assumed the responsibility of Mrs. Morris's District (in addition to her own). We all regret to know that Mrs. Morris is shortly to enter hospital for an operation; and we assure her of our prayers for her ultimate restoration to health and strength. We are grateful for the assistance so willingly and promptly given in this important part of our Church work.

Women's Guild.—The Market Day held on July 17, was a very enjoyable function. There was a very good attendance. The receipts totalled £38/17/- and were as follows:—Cakes, £10/14/-; odds and ends, £9/7/6; jam, £5/12/6; refreshments and door, £7/0/9; sweets and flowers, £5/12/3; donation received through offertory (anon.), 10/-. Miss E. M. Belfield laid the claims of CENEFF before those present, and declared the sale

open. A musical programme was contributed by Mesdames Darwin, Day and Lyttle, whom we thank very much. Thursday, July 22, was the Rector's monthly Bible Study evening. The subject chosen for study was "How a Hopeless Case is Cured" (Acts iii) and was, as usual, most instructive. A short business meeting followed when matters in connection with the Festival Tea were discussed. (If any parishioner has a "butter" coupon to give away, it will help considerably in our provisioning for the Tea). The sum of £20 was voted to be paid towards our quota for the Parish Hall Fund. The meeting closed with an "austerity" supper. Meetings for August are:—August 12, Business; August 26, The Rector's Bible Study.—V. Lucas, Hon. Secretary.

B.C.A.—Will box-holders kindly hand in their boxes on Sunday, August 8. B.C.A. supporters, their friends and all parishioners are advised that the Organising Missioner, Revd. Tom Jones, pays his annual visit to All Saints' on Sunday, September 26.

New Guinea Fund.—In connection with this fund, towards which the Women's Guild is out to raise £100 by the end of November, the following gifts of £1 each have been received from Mesdames Slee, Robertson, Bannan, Grant, Brennan and the Misses Eve, Neill, Watkins, Horton, Peard, Lucas and Olver, which, together with promises, makes the total to date £25. We want every family in the parish to help. There will be twelve weeks after our Consecration Festival and the idea is for each family to put aside 1/8 per week during that time. You won't need to be great at mathematics to know what amount you will have by the end of November. We wish to have this £100 ear-marked towards a memorial to Mavis Parkinson, who worshipped with us at All Saints' and was killed as a result of enemy action in Papua.—E. V. Adams, Organiser.

As someone said at her funeral service, "There's many a mother who will to-day thank God for Rene Brady and for the great influence for good she had upon the many children who passed through her hands." What finer tribute than that could be paid to anyone? May all who sorrow know the sustaining and comforting power of God's Holy Spirit.
