THE WINIFRED KIEK SCHOLARSHIP

This Scholarship is intended for Christian women from Asian, Indian or Pacific areas, who already have basic training in a chosen field of work.

It provides the opportunity for further training and/or experience, to better equip the scholar provide leadership in her own country, church and community.

The scholarship covers fares, tuition fees and accommodation costs, for a maximum of 5 months, and is awarded annually when possible. Preferred age for the scholar is 25 - 35 years.

FUNDS - FELLOWSHIP DAY

The offering received at the A.C.W. FELLOWSHIP DAY SERVICE, held in various Centres in July each year, is invested, and the interest used to finance the scholarship.

Additional donations are encouraged and can be made at any time to the Winifred Kiek Scholarship Fund through your state unit treasurer.

THE 1994 SCHOLAR

NIGHAT GULZAR is from Lahore, Pakistan. She has a degree in commerce and works as an accountant in the Womens' Office of the Raiwind Diocese.

Her responsibilities include preparing annual budgets, the day to day correspondence, accounting, etc. for the Womens' Office and for Dar-ul-Massaret, a centre for mentally handicapped children.

She also has responsibilities with the Womens' Fellowship of the Church of Pakistan.

Her ecumenical involvements include Womens' Concerns, Christian Conference of Asia, and the Ecumenical Leadership Workshop for Women in Asia.

Nighat hopes to improve her skills in office management whilst in Australia. She is 23 years of age and has a widowed mother and three brothers, two of whom are still being educated.

Funds will be made available triennially to provide fares, honoraria and accommodation costs to the recipient.

She will tour Australia to speak to Church and community groups telling of her work amongst the women with whom she works.

The purpose of this Fellowship is to promote knowledge and understanding, and to provide mutual inspiration for Australian women and the outstanding Christian women who are visiting, studying or residing in Australia.
