 Steps to expand the work of the Christian Retreat and Study Centre at Rajpur, Delhi, India, have been taken by the inter-denominational Centre of Management.

The board approved plans for a new resident study programme which will provide for a selected number of Christian students and lay persons to be sent in serious study at the centre.

It also approved plans to enlarge the Centre's facilities through construction of a building to house a library, recreation room, and staff offices. The centre was established in 1954 by the Protestant and Anglican churches in North India and several related organisations.

 Four Minnesota church-related colleges have announced they are establishing a faculty in ecumenical programme with 33 predominantly Negro private colleges in the South.

The Minnesota colleges will send one professor each to teach in one of the Southern schools. The Negro colleges will send eight professors North for part-time teaching at the Minnesota colleges and graduate work at the University of Minnesota.

Participating colleges are Marquette University (Methodist), Macalester College (Presbyterian), and the College of St. Thomas (Roman Catholic), all located in St. Paul, and Carleton College (Baptist-Congregational-Episcopal), Northfield, Minn.
