The circumstances of our Sav:rs Birth  
characterize in a measure the dispensation w: he  
came to introduce. The gospel exhibits a plan yet  
a profound scheme of salvation. while its great  
out lines are intelligible to the meanest baby  
city, and the way of life laid open to every one who  
who mens may read it: yet it abounds with the  
most sublime and inscrutable mysteries. such  
as made even an Apostle exclaim Ho! the  
depths of wisdom & knowledge of God how  
unsearchable are his judgments and his ways past  
finding out. Thus in the incarnation soon found there  
was an apparent meanness that was seemingly  
inscrutable to such an occasion: and at the same  
time aglowing majesty: it was worthy the  
Power and grandeur of a new born Infant, when  
the eastern magi saw his Star they immediately  
concluded that he must be born in the city of  
Jerusalem, either at the High Priests Palace  
or at Herods — for we are informed that they  
immediately left their own country and returned  
to Jerusalem and when they arrived there

2 they said where is he wh<sup>t</sup> is born King of of Jesus  
for we have seen his Star in the East and are  
come to worship him. no doubt they expected  
to see him in all the pomp of Royalty, and  
persons of the highest rank paying Homage  
to the new born King - How greatly were they  
disappointed when they found that no Tidings of his  
Birth had reached the rulers of the Jewish  
Nation, and that even Herod & all Jerusalem  
instead of rejoicing at the news which the  
wise man carried, were troubled at those glad  
tidings of great Joy - They <sup>at not finding the way</sup> were  
greatly disappointed yet they were not to  
be discouraged from seeking after him. when  
they found him it was not in a Palace, but in a  
stable - no royal boudoir nor swaddling bands  
were prepared for him, he had only a manger  
for his Reception - yet did an Angel come from  
Heaven to announce his birth, and an host of  
Angels attended to proclaim his Praise and bring  
glory to h<sup>r</sup> in the highest and on Earth peace  
and good will towards men - on this divine &  
heavenly glo<sup>r</sup>y of incarnation of Christ is represented

he has put down all rule and all Authority.  
and destroyed all his and his peoples enemies -
