LETTER FROM ACTING RECTOR

Dear Parishioners,

By the time you are reading these sentences, I shall have handed over the care of the Parish to your new Rector, Rev. R. A. Johnson. I have thoroughly enjoyed my time with you, for I have found the work extremely interesting, and I have received much kindness from many people. I like to think of a Parish as an individual; just as an individual develops and enriches his personality by the number of relationships he forms with his friends, so a Parish develops by the infusion of new ideas and new influences. The Church in Petersham benefits greatly from the life and ministry of your late Rector, Rev. C. E. Adams. But it would not be good to think of carrying on exactly as he left the Parish, this would mean stagnation. Your new Rector comes, a new personality, with all the influences and relationships that have gone into his own development, to enrich the life of the Parish. A new combination is to be formed, not just for the convenience or enjoyment of the people, but for the Glory of God. God has a constant need of a Body of people through whom he can shine and reveal himself—We must never lose sight of this. Our Church exists for God's use. Each individual has the task of developing his own personal relationship with God, through Christ. "That Christ may reign in your hearts through Faith." Then each loses himself in the Corporate Body of the Church, and finds himself as something bigger and better than himself, as God expresses His purpose and His nature through the Church.

I am happy and proud to have been able to share in your corporate life for these few months. It is a sad time when a workman has to lay aside the tools he can no longer use, and correspondingly it is an invigorating experience for a retired priest to be allowed to exercise the talents which he has been developing for many years.

May God grant you rich blessing in the years to come, by giving you still greater tasks to carry out.

At the conclusion of the service there will be a gathering in the Parish Hall for the purpose of welcoming Mr. and Mrs. Johnson, their son and daughter. The Wardens express the hope that there will be a large congregation at the Induction Service and in the Parish Hall.
