

AUSTRALIAN CHURCH WOMEN - NSW STATE UNIT

Minutes of the Council Meeting held at 222 Pitt Street, Sydney, on Monday
24 April 1995

Prior to commencing the meeting, President Lucelle King extended congratulations and birthday greetings (joined by the members) to Doris Haberfield who had last week celebrated her 80th birthday. Mrs Haberfield responded with thanks.

Devotions having commenced the AGM immediately prior to this meeting, the President proceeded to welcome members and visitors.

PRESENT AND APOLOGIES: There were 42 in attendance, with 14 apologies. An apology was received from H Reid who has been ill. H Richardson thanked members for their prayers on behalf of her seven-month-old grandson, Thomas, whose condition is now stable. Our continued prayers were sought as the baby has now been moved to the Prince of Wales Children's Hospital suffering from severe combined immune deficiency.

MINUTES OF MARCH MEETING were confirmed as a correct record.

BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES 1. Invitations for Dedication Service on 15 May now available and members were asked to distribute them widely within their denomination, bringing as many folk with them to the Service as possible. It should be seen to be an opportunity to expand, bringing others to see what ACW is all about. It was noted that a well-balanced menu is in hand for the luncheon. Ushers for the Service would be L Maze, R Phillis, J Baker, M Craig and B Elliott. The Trading Table would be supervised by E Cox, helped by Churches of Christ members. Those branches having a banner were asked to see that it was supported by 4' poles. It was agreed that items brought in for the trading table should be priced beforehand.

2. Special Functions: Ecumenical Luncheon on 17 July - Sr Lynne Green will speak on "Women in Ecumenism - a Search for Visible Unity". Commencing at 11 am, luncheon will be served at 12 noon and the function should finish at 1.45.

Spiritual Enrichment Day on 9 October - Speakers - Joy Jarman and Sheila Spencer (who is on the staff of the Anglican Evangelism Department).

3. ACWC Service - As the Burwood venue is not available, J Tong will try Campsie SA (Korean) or St Andrew's Anglican (Chinese).

4. National Conference: ^{Johns} 21-25 August - details discussed and Application Forms distributed.

5. Notices of Motion: Executive to prepare motion re Disaster Fund and also re changing the name of ACW to Church Women United (CWU). It was agreed that the word "Australia" should also be added - CHURCH WOMEN UNITED AUST.

7. NCW Awards 1995: It was agreed that we submit Marie McCann's name and E Ridge to work on a profile. Mrs McCann was congratulated.

8. 'A Day Away': Highly recommended by E Ridge - 13 May.

National Minutes of 31 March received: Noted (Corresp. 9) that a letter had been received from Bishop Arthur Malcolm, Aboriginal and Islander Commission - enclosing copy of overview of 3-year project undertaken by Ms Anne Pattel-Gray. Its purpose was to bring greater awareness of culture and daily struggles of Aboriginal women. Letter to be sent to Ms Pattel-Gray seeking information on ways in which ACW could possibly support her project.
Noted that a letter from Shirin Samuel advised that FLC celebrates its 40th Anniversary next year. State Units encouraged to stock up on FLC spoons and a special Circle of Prayer booklet which is to be produced.
Noted that Executive members were being asked to consider ways of promoting ACW in Northern Territory. Will advise of our contact in Alice Springs.
19. Thank you card received from Deaconess Mary Andrews who appreciated 80th birthday greetings last month. A founding member of ACW, Deaconess thanked God "for the women of vision, venture and vitality who, as they have been led by the Holy Spirit, have done so much to spread the message of God's redeeming love..."

REPORTS: The Treasurer's statement was received. Noted that \$1500 from FLC and \$1500 from Administration has been invested with the Uniting Church Trust Assoc. On-call Account at 7%. Marie encouraged members to remember the Trading Table at meetings and to pay their donation for Morning Tea which goes to Overseas Travel Fund.

FLC: Devotion was taken from "The Voice from Thailand" - 'True Partnership in Christ'.

WKS: Noted from National Minutes that Nighat Gulzar was married in November last. Letter received from Doreen (Tie) Tan. Mina spoke of the photographic exhibition in Sydney "Images of the Elderly" in which Deaconess Mary Andrews had featured and commended this exhibition of works of young photographers to members.

PROMOTION: Reminder given that Packing Day will be 22 May at 10.30 in Rm 5a. Edith was asked to read the Memorial Minute she has prepared for the late Win. Dougherty who was a Life Member of ACW NSW Unit:

Win Dougherty was appointed as a delegate to Australian Church Women (NSW Unit) by the Methodist Church, through the Federation of Methodist Women, NSW.

She was elected State Secretary of ACW and served from 1967 to 1970.

When it was the turn of the Methodist Federation to nominate a State President for ACW, the Federation chose Win Dougherty, who was installed into that position in 1973 at Chatswood Central Church, and she served for one year.

In 1977 she was appointed to the position of National President of ACW and led a team of NSW women for two years, chairing the National Conference in Sydney in 1979.

It was at this Conference that Church Women United women from USA came on a 'Causeway Visit'. Win returned this visit with a team of Australian women to USA. In 1977 the NSW State Unit made Win Dougherty a Life Member.

*She attended the meetings of Asian Church Women's Conference in Japan, during 1978, as Australian Representative.
Win served as a Methodist and Uniting Church delegate to ACW with great distinction.
Her knowledge of and interest in ACW was profound.
She was a tireless worker for all organisations in which she served.
