THE RECTOR'S LETTER.

All Saints' Rectory, 28th August, 1944.

Dear People of All Saints',—

It is with a deep sense of thankfulness that we record the success of another Consecration Festival. The services throughout the day were very well attended, and many people have spoken of the inspiration and help they gained from them. A special word of appreciation and thanks is due to our Organist and Choirmaster and the members of our Choir for their consistently good work throughout the day, which contributed so greatly to the success of the services. We were glad to have Senior Chaplain Blake as the occasional preacher at Evensong, and thank him for his interesting and timely message. It was pleasing to note that quite a number of the relatives of the men and women in the Services responded to the invitation to attend this service. We were fortunate, also, in having the help of Chaplain C. H. Sherlock (R.A.A.F.), who was on leave, and kindly assisted at the early celebration.


You will be glad to know that the Special Appeal (in lieu of a fete) has already exceeded any previous year, realising to date £183/13/11. There are still a number of boxes to come in, and possibly there are some parishioners who have not yet returned the special envelope issued last month. We might even reach the "two-hundred" mark before the appeal is finished! At any rate, we should be glad if any outstanding boxes and envelopes might be returned so soon as possible. The Wardens join me in sincerely thanking all our parishioners and friends, who, by their special gifts, have enabled us to meet the responsibilities of our Parish Hall debt for the eighth year in succession without a fete.

Rain falling steadily up till noon on the day of our Festival Tea made the prospects look somewhat gloomy, but fortunately the weather cleared in the afternoon, and there was not a vacant place at any one of the eleven tables, proving that though the affinity between "food" and "fellowship" may be strange, it is very real! Mr. Harold Lobb (Organist of St. Clement's, Marrickville) gave a most enjoyable recital after the tea, and, after Evensong an attractive concert programme (kindly arranged by Mrs. G. Clifton Smith) was presented in the Parish Hall, when the Misses Bessie Cooke and Betty Lovell and Mr. Ross Parsons were very acceptable vocalists, and our old friend, "Weirido," rejoiced the hearts of the young, and not so young, in his inimitable fashion. After Mr. E. C. King had spoken regarding the progress of the special appeal, and had voiced the Churchwardens' appreciation of the people's response, another happy Consecration Festival was brought to a conclusion by the Rector's few words of thanks to all who helped to make it so successful, followed by a silent remembrance of all serving in the King's Forces, and the singing of the National Anthem.

I pass on to you some words from a broadcast address of Lord Lang, of Lambeth (a former Archbishop of Canterbury), on April 23. They will not reach you before the day on which we are called to prayer by His Majesty the King, but they are applicable to any and every day of prayer. Lord Lang said: "We dare not offer our prayers in any spirit of self-righteousness, as who should say, 'Thank God, we are not as other men, as these Germans, are.' That sin of self-righteousness is an absolute bar to the throne of God. Against the dark background of the sins of the Nazi rulers and of the German nation in so far as it has accepted or justified their rule, we must set our own sins, personal and national, with a new clearness. I will not dwell upon the signs of selfishness, the mean pilfering and evasions of the law, the sexual laxity which have marred the spirit which our people generally have shown during these five years. But in all honesty I must stress a sin which is itself a main root of all sin: neglect of God and of His claim on our lives. If at this crisis in our history we come to God in prayer for victory, part

of our prayer must be: "Turn Thy face from our sins and put out all our misdeeds. Make us a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within us."

MATTERS MAINLY PAROCHIAL.

Parish Festival Tea.—As there is still some ticket-money outstanding, the statement is held over until next issue. To all who contributed by generous gifts, by their willing co-operation, and by their determination to maintain (in spite of all difficulties) the high standard of our annual tea, we say, "Thank you" with all the sincerity of which we are capable!

Choir.—It was with deep regret that we learned of the passing of Mrs. Ritchie, mother of our esteemed Choir Secretary. Remembering that this is the second bereavement she has suffered in less than eight months, we would like her to know how deeply her fellow Choir-members sympathise with her and her relatives.

We are pleased to notice the increase in the ranks of the Choir-boys, and hope those ranks may increase, or at least be maintained. During the school holidays there is bound to be a decrease in attendance. Choristers are expected to attend both morning and evening services, and must be regular at practices.—C.E.A.

Women's Guild.—All our energies this month have been directed towards the catering for our Festival Tea, which was held on August 23. It took some doing, in these days of rationing, but we did it. It was a "scrumptious" tea, thanks to the generosity of our parishioners, and especially to those ladies who acted as hostesses. I think we can easily say that the Tea was "the best ever." A big "thank you" to you all, and also to Mrs. Messer for her generous gift of flowers, wherewith to decorate the tables, and to those who sent lilies for our church decorations. Never have we had such quantities of lilies. They made our church, which is always beautiful, look most glorious. The meetings for the month are: September 14, Business; September 28, "Salmagundi" Evening in conjunction with C.E.N.E.F., in aid of the Cathedral Hut Stall. The C.E.N.E.F. Branch conducts this Stall every year. We do hope you will all come to the evening and bring either cakes, jam, or groceries, as these commodities are "best sellers." The proceeds from the Stall help to finance some part of the great work which the Anglican Church is doing for all divisions of the Forces.

C.E.N.E.F.—It is good to know that our Secretary, Miss Belfield, is progressing after her serious illness. We hope she will soon be with us again. Don't forget the Cathedral Stall in Cathedral grounds. Our day—Friday, September 29.

All Saints' Sunday School.—At the last Teachers' Meeting it was decided to hold a concert in the Parish Hall on Tuesday, 10th October. As the young people are working hard to make this a success, we would like the support of their parents and friends.

Confirmation.—Preparation Classes have already been formed: for boys on Tuesday, and for girls on Thursday, both classes being held at the Rectory, commencing at 7.30 p.m. Sunday, October 22, is the date fixed for Confirmation at All Saints', Petersham.

Quarterly Offertory.—Sunday, September 24, will be our Quarterly Offertory Sunday.

Visiting Preachers.—The Rev. H. C. Cohen, who has recently returned from the Diocese of Melanesia, will preach here on Sunday evening, September 10th. Early in October we shall have our annual visit from the Brotherhood of The Good Shepherd. On Sunday evening, October 8th, the Rev. James Wood, Vice-Principal of The Brotherhood, will be the preacher.

C.E.F.—At a recent meeting we had a visit from Miss Ethne Nixon, Director of Youth Work for A.B.M. As a result of Miss Nixon's Talk, we have decided to support a Native Scholar, and also to do some practical work to meet the needs of the Mission Stations.
