## DEDICATION FESTIVALS.

The anniversary of the dedication of the Churches of this Parish are both drawing near, and are being diligently prepared for by the workers of All Saints' and of the Mission Church.

The first in order will be the—

**Anniversary of the Mission Church**, which will be observed on Sunday, October 25th, when the special services will be as follows:—

11 a.m., Morning Service.

3 p.m., Children's Festival Service.

7.30 p.m., Evening Service.

The names of the special preachers at these services will be announced in due course.

**The Anniversary Tea Meeting** will be held on Tuesday, October 27th, in the Hall next the Church. An excellent programme is in preparation, and it is especially to be noted that this is meant to be a gathering of worshippers at the Mission Church, and of others who are interested in its work and progress. We hope to see a large attendance of adults, and especially of men, this year.

**All Saints' Church.**—All Saints' Day, Sunday, November 1st, will be the thirty-eighth anniversary of the dedication of All Saints' Church. SPECIAL SERVICES will be held, and special sermons preached appropriate to the occasion, of which further announcement will be made. The offertories for the day will be devoted to the *Parochial General Church Fund*. There will be two celebrations of Holy Communion, viz. at 7.30 and at 11 o'clock. So many amongst us this day is filled with holy associations as they seek to realize the precious lessons of the clause of the Creed, in which we state our belief that there is a "Communion of Saints." To all of us there is cause for thanksgiving for the spiritual mercies vouchsafed through the means of grace during another year of the Church's work in this parish. Let us gather in large numbers at the Holy Table that we may, in the ordinance of the Lord's own Commandment, give thanks.

In connection with the Dedication Festival there will also be the following services and other arrangements:—

**The Annual Choral Festival** will be held on Monday, November 2nd, at 7.45 p.m., when the choirs of the parish will be supplemented by choristers from S. Andrew's Cathedral, S. John's Church, Balmain, and others. There will be no tickets issued for this service on this occasion. The rented sittings will be free after the second bell has been rung.

The name of the special preacher at this service will be announced in our next issue. The collection will be devoted to the Choir Fund.

**The Parish Fair** will be opened in the Petersham Town Hall on Thursday, November 5th, by Miss Margaret Harris. Parishioners and friends are invited to send contributions for any of the stalls, either on Thursday morning to the Town Hall, or previously to the Rectory.

**The Sunday Schools' Picnic.**—It is proposed to hold the Sunday schools' picnic on Tuesday, November 17th, when both the Parish Church schools and the Mission Church schools will join together, for what it is expected will be a most enjoyable outing. Correy's Gardens has been chosen as being pleasant, safe, and reasonably near home, with splendid shelter from heat or storm. The popularity of this well-known resort made it difficult for the committee to select an available day, as the Gardens were pre-engaged on all Wednesdays and Saturdays.
