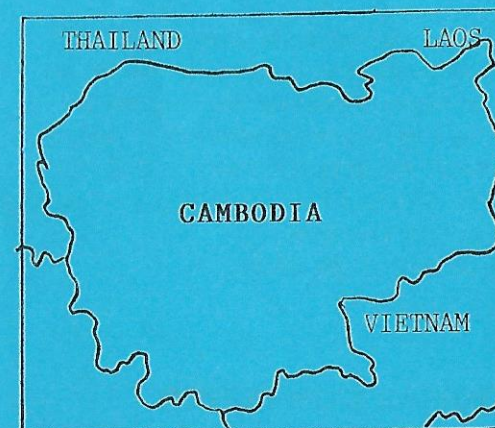

THE WINIFRED KIEK SCHOLARSHIP (WKS)

This Scholarship is intended for Christian women from multicultural Australia, Pacific Island Nations and member countries of Asian Church Women's Conference who already have basic training in a chosen field of work.

It provides the opportunity for further training to better equip the scholar to provide leadership in her own country, church and community. The scholarship covers fares, tuition fees and accommodation and is awarded annually.

When it is deemed more appropriate the Scholarship Funds may be used for designated education/charitable projects for women through the National Council of Churches of Australia World Christian Service.

FUNDS - FELLOWSHIP DAY

The offerings received at the Australian Church Women Fellowship Day Services, held in various centres in July each year, are invested, and the interest used to finance the scholarship. Additional donations are encouraged and may be made at any time to the Winifred Kiek Scholarship Fund through your State Unit Treasurer.

CAMBODIAN CHRISTIAN WOMEN'S ASSOCIATION (CCWA)

The CCWA began its activities in 1993 when a group of women gathered together at the then World Council of Churches (WCC) Office in Phnom Penh to pray and worship God. In 1994, with the support of the WCC Asia Desk and Christian Conference of Asia Indochina Program, CCWA took the initiative to register as a Non-Government Organisation, was officially recognised by the Government of Cambodia on 13 July 1994 and then commenced certain development programs.

The programs receiving our support will be courses in:

**Tailoring and Weaving,
Literacy
English Language Training.**

Other programs CCWA plans to continue are the 'Empowering Women in Leadership Program'; and the 'Rural Credit Program', which aims to help women in rural areas enhance their living standards.

MISS RACHEL ROLLAND

We are pleased to advise that Rachel has been able to take up the 'Women's Leadership Development Training Course' at the Training in Ministry and Leadership (TIMAL) Training Centre, Malmaluan, Rabaul PNG in 1996.

As you may be aware, Rachel was the 1995 Scholar, but because of the volcanic eruptions near Rabaul in 1994 her course was postponed for 12 months.

THE WKS TRUSTEES

The Trustees of the Scholarship, located in Adelaide, are responsible for investing funds and acting as an advisory body to the National Executive of Australian Church Women.

WINIFRED KIEK FELLOWSHIP

At the discretion of the Trustees, in consultation with the National Executive, funds will be made available (on a predetermined basis) to invite a representative from the following bodies:- Asian Church Women's Conference; The Pacific Council of Churches; Past Winifred Kiek Scholars; The Fellowship of the Least Coin International Committee; Church Women United Aotearoa/ NZ; or a noted Christian women leader: to attend the National Conference of Australian Church Women and visit State Units.

An outstanding Christian women visiting Australia at any other time may be invited to visit State Units under such a Fellowship.

AUSTRALIAN CHURCH WOMEN BURSARY BOOK

You are invited to nominate a Christian woman whose association with the work of Australian Church Women is noteworthy.

Donations are invited and the interest earned from the invested monies is used to provide a book grant to current Scholarship holders.

A profile and photograph of the woman so honoured is then recorded in the Bursary Book, held by the National WKS Convenor.
