It is with some sadness that we announce the closing of "Wybalena" in December 1966. The rise in upkeep costs, the difficulty of getting trained reliable staff and the changed attitude of girls to hostel life have brought us to this decision.

We have given fifteen years' service to girls and feel it has been a worthwhile effort. Our sincere thanks go to all for help you have given us financially and in service.

"Wybalena" was an experiment in Church union and as far as the Hostel Committee is concerned, we have had the happiest fellowship and enjoyed our work, which at times has been very strenuous.

The proceeds of the sale of "Wybalena" will be earning interest until we determine their future use.

N.S.W. WOMEN'S INTER-CHURCH COUNCIL "WYBALENA" HOSTEL REPORT 1966-67.

It is with a sense of sadness I present the 14th. and final report of "Wybalena" Hostel.

We commenced this year with 17 girls in residence and when we closed the Hostel there were 12 girls - not many of these being among the original 17 -.

Five meetings were held with an average of 10 members attending.

We record our appreciation of the Matron, Mrs. Randle, who carried on without the aid of a cook for many weeks thus saving us from a greater deficiency than \$782 - 21 for the seven months.

Our Registrar, Mrs. Knight, has had a very busy time with girls entering and leaving the Hostel so often.

The Treasurer, Mr. Chambers has kept a firm hold on our finances and has bravely attended our meetings. Mr. Chambers was very concerned at our monthly deficit brought about by the small number of girls in residence so the Committee asked Mrs. Millar to consult her Co-Trustees. Their advice was to sell "Wybalena" as soon as possible, to Bank the money realised from the sale of the property pending re-investment. The sale of "Wybalena" was discussed at W.I.C.C. meetings and the vote to sell was unanimous.

Cash in Bank on 29th. May, 1967 stands at \$27651 - 28 The trading loss of \$782 - 21 for seven months fully justified the decision to close the Hostel.

Our annual appeal letter, Christmas cards and cooking demonstration all helped to reduce our trading costs.

I appreciate all the help and support given me by the President, Mrs. Stolz and members of the Committee and know that we all have a feeling of sadness, that, owing to changing times and conditions, we are unable to carry on.

As President of the Wybalena Hostel Appeal sponsored by the N.S.W. Women's Inter-Church Council, I am writing to ask for your practical co-operation and assistance to help establish a much needed hostel for country, Interstate and city girls who can find no suitable accommodation in Sydney while studying or in business. The need particularly for country girls cannot be over-stressed.

Every available hostel has a long waiting list up to three years, and until such hostels as the one we have in view are available, our girls are in definite moral danger because of the undesirable residencies which, unfortunately, they are compelled to use.

Immediate action is therefore imperative if a desirable property is to be purchased. Therefore, your generous and early response will be greatly appreciated.

XM3-139 The hostel will not be a profit-making business concern, but should become self-supporting. The property will be vested in three trustees, and its management controlled by the Council's Hostel Committee.

A suitable building can be purchased only if we have the financial support of the community. This constructive project is a practical follow-up gesture after the flood relief given so liberally.

I would therefore urge all country, as well as city dwellers, to give generously. Organisations, business firms, churches and citizens are invited to send cheques and donations as promptly as possible to the above address payable to "Wybalena Hostel Appeal."

11. ALTERATION TO CONSTITUTION:

This constitution may be altered at any meeting of the Appeal Committee after notice of the substance of the proposed alteration shall have been given at the previous meeting of such Committee and subject to the subsequent approval of the General Committee.

12. DISSOLUTION:

- (a) The Appeal Committee may be dissolved at any time at a meeting of such Committee convened for the purpose after not less than one month's notice of the intention to move a resolution for the dissolution of the Appeal Committee shall have been given to each member of the Committee and of the General Committee and subject to subsequent approval of the General Committee.
- (b) Any assets of the Hostel Committee remaining after the dissolution thereof shall be applied as nearly as possible for the objects of the Appeal Committee in such manner as the meeting of the Appeal Committee which resolves upon the dissolution of the Appeal Committee may determine and if and insofar as effect cannot be given to the aforesaid provision then for some other charitable object as shall be determined by such meeting.

AUXILIARIES:

- (a) The committee may establish auxiliaries to widen interest in objects of the Committee and raise money therefor.
- (b) Each auxiliary shall have a President one or more Vice-Presidents a Secretary and a Treasurer.
- (c) Proper minutes and books of account shall be kept and audited each year by a qualified auditor and a copy of Annual Report and Balance Sheet of the Auxiliary shall be sent to the Appeal Committee.
- (d) Each auxiliary may open and operate on a Banking Account at such bank as may be authorised by letter from the Secretary of the Appeal Committee.
- (e) Whenever £20 is raised it shall be remitted to the Appeal Committee.
- (f) Each Auxiliary shall be entitled to appoint annually on representative as a member of the Appeal Committee and to fill any casual vacancies.
