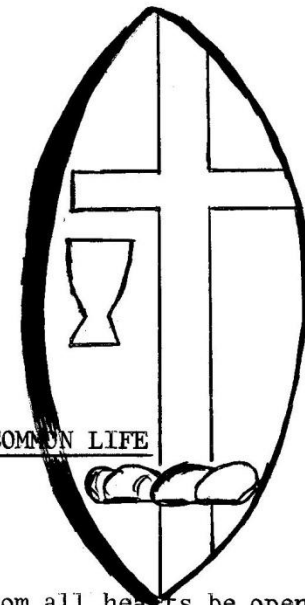

## WORSHIP SERVICE:

## FELLOWSHIP DAY

### SHARING THE COMMON LIFE

STUDY MATERIAL: I John:1:1 - 10.

This study has been prepared for use on FELLOWSHIP DAY. It is suggested that the study be used in groups of 8 - 10 with a leader who has had the opportunity of preparation by having had the material prior to the day.

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A short commentary on the passage.

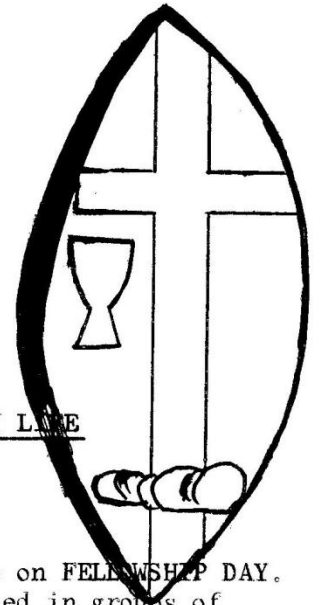
The 'key' to life is in God's hands - and always has been. In the fullness of time Jesus Christ came to demonstrate the meaning of eternal life. He did this by living in the world.

Those who experience this 'life' must declare it so that others may share this 'greatest good'.

The heart of this good news is that God is Light. There is no darkness in Him. Christians are those who walk in the steps of Christ - in the Light. Therefore if we claim to be living His life and continue to walk in darkness, our lives are a contradiction. But if we walk in the light then we share His life and His cleansing power will make us clean.

As we walk side by side, we share together a common life, a life inspired and illuminated by God, but also beset by failure and sin.

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## TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION

- (A)
1. Evangelism and missionary work are often thought of as inviting others to join in the activities of a certain group (e.g. the congregation on Sunday, women's guild, youth group or a 'fellowship'). Is this because we cannot or dare not speak from our own experience?
  2. "Christians are very ordinary people making extraordinary claims" - D.T. Niles. I John I: 1 - 4 suggests that evangelism consists of declaring not inviting.  
What difference ought this to make to -
    - i. your conversation in the street
    - ii. your church magazine
    - iii. the leadership of the worship of the congregation
    - iv. the possibility of a united campaign of Christian evangelism in your district?
- (B)
- The Church should be a training ground for saints - i.e. for people who more and more desire to share the divine life. But congregational services and programmes often seem to be geared to maintaining existing levels of spiritual life.
- i. Why have so many congregations and ministers become content with a low average standard of Christian conduct and devotion?
  - ii. What can be done to encourage an understanding of the need to "progress" in Christian faith?

- (C)
- "Jesus Christ has reconciled us to God. Yet we do not live together as his one flock. We all invoke the name of the Lord Jesus Christ.
- We are his people, a single people and yet still unable to glorify and praise him in unity"
- from introduction to the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity leaflet 1964.
- Yet many still affirm that our denominationalism is not sinful.
1. What must we do in the light of I John I: 8 - 10 ?
  2. Would you agree with this quotation from "The Hard Facts of Unity" by John Lawrence (SCM Press 1961);  
"There can be little further progress towards unity until hundreds of thousands of men, women and children in the pews of our churches begin to see some things which they do not at all want to see."

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Each member of the group is asked to read the Bible passage and commentary in quiet meditation. As the questions are studied allow time for individual members to read them and then share their discoveries with their neighbour sitting next to them. Then ask the group to share their findings and their further questions.
