THE RECTOR'S LETTER.

All Saints' Rectory,
30th August, 1943.

Dear People of All Saints',

Once again we record, with a deep sense of gratitude, that our Consecration Festival was most successful from every point of view. We were favoured with fine weather (always an uncertain factor in August!) and all the services were both inspiring and helpful. A special word of appreciation is due to our Choir-members who, from the early choral celebration to the singing of the recessional hymn at Evensong ("Thy Hand O God has guided," sung to Harwood's fine tune "Thornbury") did consistently good work, and contributed very largely to the inspirational character of the services. We were pleased to have Canon F. W. Tugwell as the occasional preacher at matins, and thank him for his appropriate message.

You will all be interested to know that the special appeal (in lieu of a fete) is already almost up to last year's total—having reached £161/14/7. There are still ten boxes to come in, and perhaps there are some parishioners who have not yet returned the Special Envelope issued with the August "Chronicle"; so we should exceed last year's figures when the appeal is finalised. The Churchwardens join me in wholeheartedly thanking **ALL**, who, by these special gifts, have enabled us to meet the liabilities of our Parish Hall debt for a seventh year without a fete.

Notwithstanding the heavy rain, the Parish Festival Tea again proved a time of happy fellowship and reunion. When, after a showery day, the rain started about 5 o'clock to come down in earnest, we saw nothing but half-empty tables and piles of uneaten food before our anxious eyes! But it is a tribute to the loyalty of our people that they turned up almost "to a man"—there were remarkably few empty places at the tables, and those visions of mountains of good unconsumed edibles proved to be but visions! Mr. Harold Lobb (Organist of St. Clement's, Marrickville) gave a very enjoyable recital after the tea, and, after evensong, an attractive programme was presented in the Parish Hall, when Mrs. Charles Heesh, Miss Daphne Vaughan, Mr. Hickson and Master Cecil Davey (Soloists); Misses Peggy Messer, Maurine Thompson and Phyllis Walker (instrumentalists); and the ever-welcome "Weirdo" entertained us in good style; Miss Beryl Wheeler and Mrs. Davey kindly acting as accompanists. After Mr. E. C. King had spoken on the progress of the special appeal and thanked parishioners for their response, our Festival was brought to a happy conclusion. We are indeed grateful to **ALL** parishioners and friends who contributed to its success.

I notice it is just twelve months since we reverted to evening services; which prompts me to say that I hope, with the passing of severe winter conditions, with their more than usual accompaniment of sickness, we may have better evening congregations. The Festival Sunday was proof positive that people **can** come in the evenings if they will. The morning congregation has been quite good lately, but, with the exception of the Festival, the evenings leave much to be desired. The critical days through which we are passing have **not** awakened people from their lethargy and indifference to spiritual things. There are about 150 families represented on our Prayer List of those serving with the Forces. If only one from each family came **once** per Sunday, they would form a nucleus of a good congregation; but so many are quite content to allow their corporate prayer to be done by others. It is not unfair to claim that God can be, and is, with us in this struggle, for whatever our faults may be, we do seem to be standing up for the common decencies of life, and fighting for something which it would be a tragedy for our world to

lose—human liberty which is something of the essence of the very Gospel itself. But let us remember that to say this, increases our responsibility, and we can only claim that God is with us, insofar as we are with Him, and honour His Name and His Day and reverence His laws. Lord Gort (now Governor of Gibraltar) before he left England some time ago, gave a broadcast in which he said: "In the pursuit of material gain and possessing, as so many did, a pleasant life, plenty of relaxation and not too long hours, we were apt to forget that the strength of Britain in the past was built up on service. Neglecting our religious obligations in the pursuit of pleasure we filled the roads, but deserted the churches." Which is an analysis equally true of Australia, and the question is, if this concerns you, what are **YOU** going to **DO** about it?

Former Colleagues.—We were pleased to have the assistance of our former colleague Rev. D. A. Ridley, at the Celebration on the Festival Sunday. Mr. Ridley has accepted the position of Assistant Chaplain of the mission to seamen at Durban. The Rev. R. A. B. Nicholls was also with us recently, when passing through Sydney on his way to take up work in the Diocese of New Guinea. We wish them both every happiness in their new sphere of service.

The Y.C.I.—The Ladies' night held early in August was one of the happiest Y.C.I. meetings of the year. About thirty guests and members assembled, and after a short business meeting the evening was given over to a games programme. The games were novel, and comprised a species of indoor cricket, billiard table bowls, table hockey, and Very Minnie Golf! The evening was rounded off by supper served in the Guild Room.
